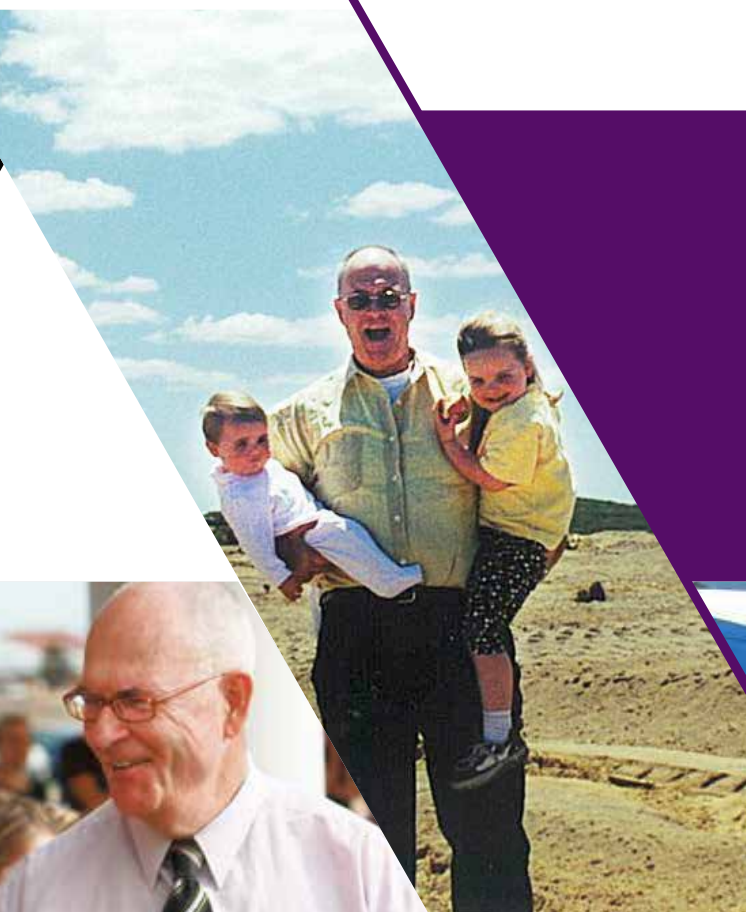

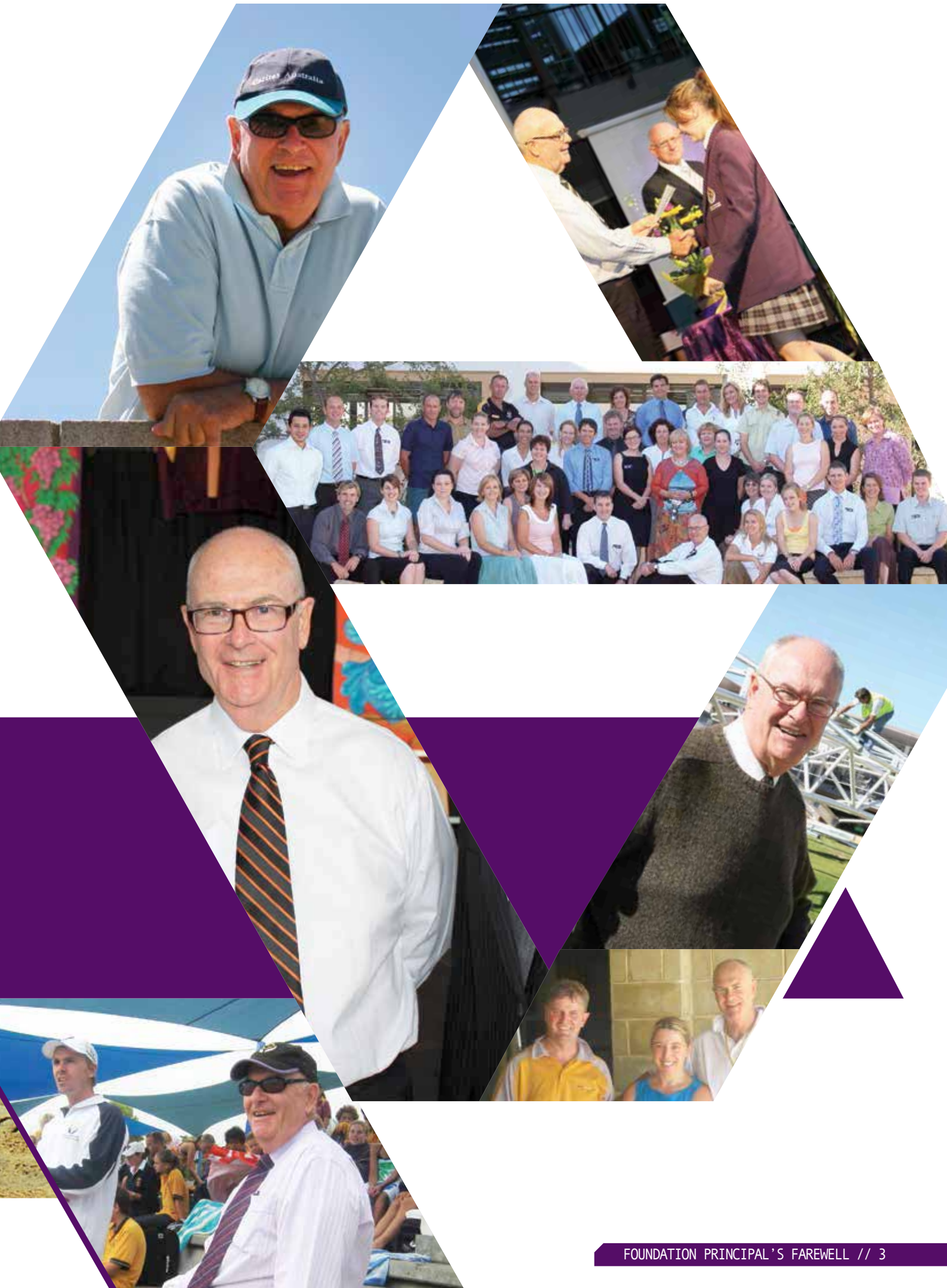

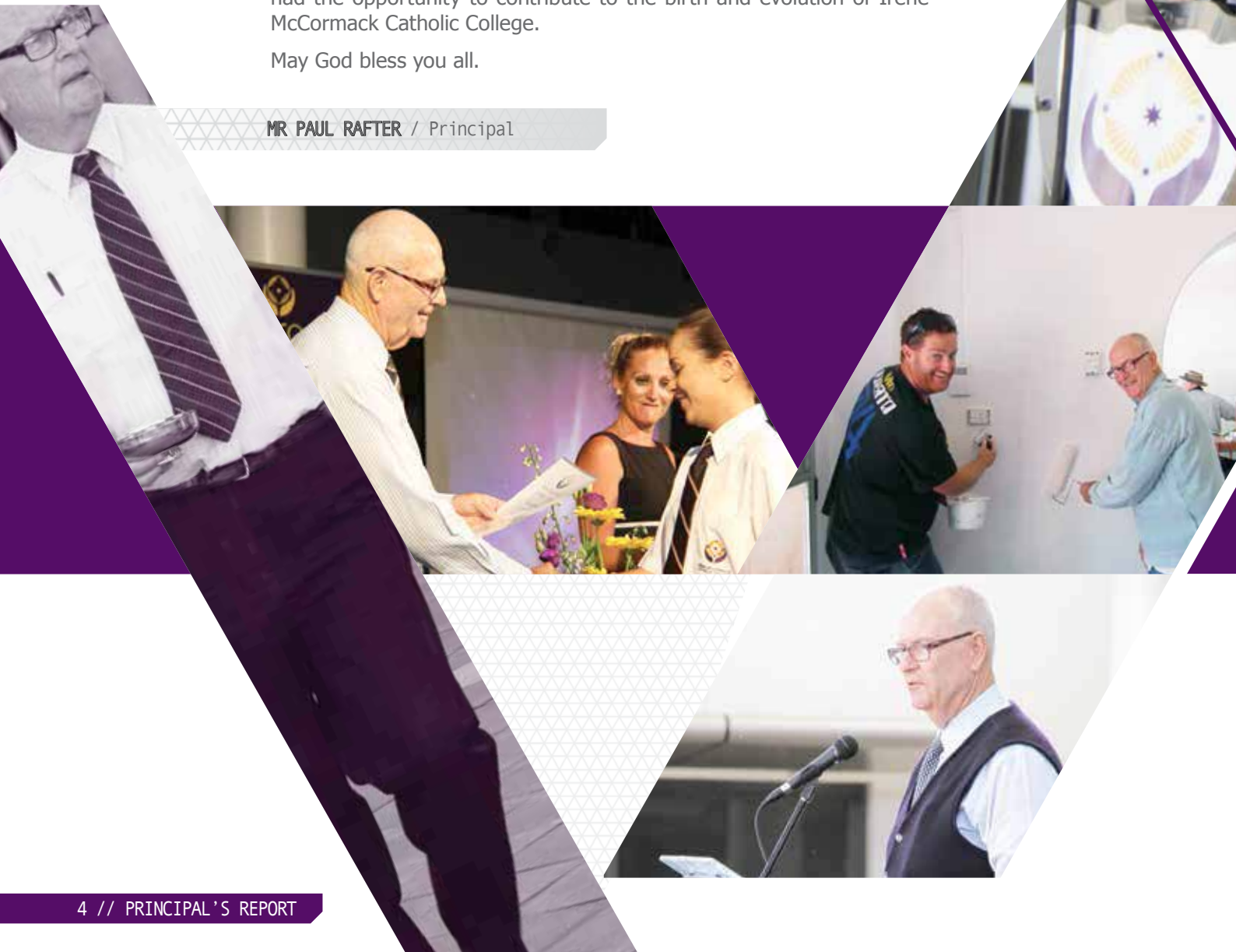
In many ways, the difficulties encountered by staff and students have shaped the culture at the College. Creativity and initiative have shaped a culture which is committed, generous and supportive.

Each step, each breath, each mouthful of food or sip of drink, each place to sleep, each sunrise, each experience, each person or companion encountered became valued and recognised as a gift ... as precious. While I always had some appreciation of the gift of life, this month long journey with nothing but a backpack certainly amplified my awareness in a big way.





The capacity to appreciate life (even in its struggles) as a gift to be celebrated and shared, comes as our College Prayer states through "an openness and serenity". CHRISTIAN SERVICE

The 2013 Christian Service Program ran again in Years 7, 9, 11 and 12. After an interview process, Year 12 students were selected for a voluntary Senior Project. This year four amazing young women took on the challenge. Lisa Muir, Kimberley Dimer, Melissa Maley and Ziahn Johnson did a combined total of 1131 hours service out in the community for Senior Project.

Year 7 students completed a minimum of 20 activities in a variety of areas including Home Service, Parish Service, College Service and Community Service. In Term 4 they took over the Year 9 activity at Brighton Catholic Primary Schools Math Buddies Program.

Year 9 students continued to work with our Community Service partners; working with volunteers at Quinns Rocks Adult Day Centre, St Vincent De Paul Clothing Store, Salvation Army Clothing Store, Bullwinkle Lodge at RAAFA and St Andrews Church. Every Year 9 student completed a minimum of 20 hours service.





Year 11 students worked on many projects this year including raising money for the homeless with the 40 Hours Without in Term 1 and the Winter Sleepout in Term 3. Year 11 students volunteered for the sixth year at the City to Surf, where 35 staff and students manned the Marathon Recovery Tent on the finish line. We also had a dedicated team of Year 11 students volunteering every Wednesday and Friday morning at Merriwa Primary School for Breakfast Club, and every Friday afternoon students travelled to the Red Cross Headquarters in East Perth to wash the Red Cross Soup Vans.



Students and staff across all year groups helped with our fundraising efforts with Tin Drives, Easter Raffles and Cake Stalls, with all funds raised going to Catholic agencies including Lifelink, Caritas and Shopfront. Every day I am grateful that I have the opportunity to see our students at their very best, helping those in need in our community.

INTEGRATED STUDIES



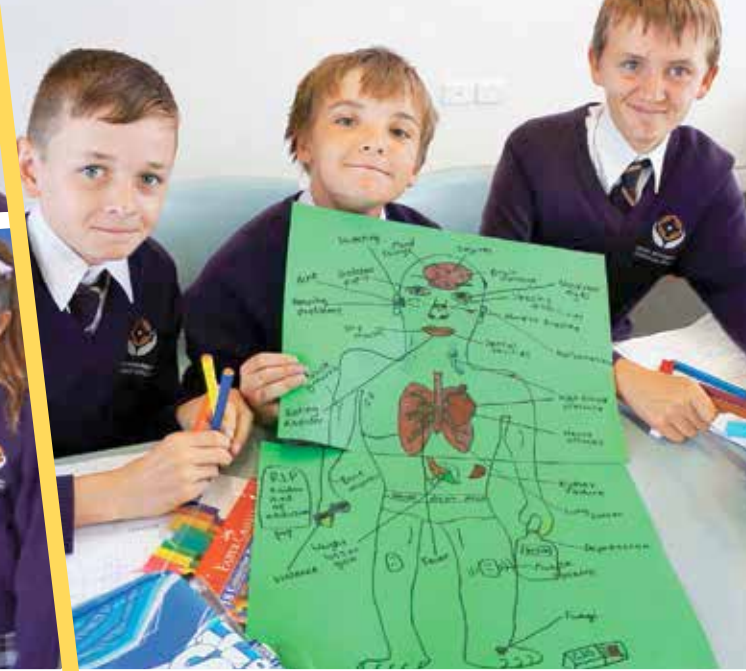

By raising their consciousness about transitioning from boy to man and girl to woman, and having conversations with them, we assisted in guiding their journey into adulthood and senior College life.



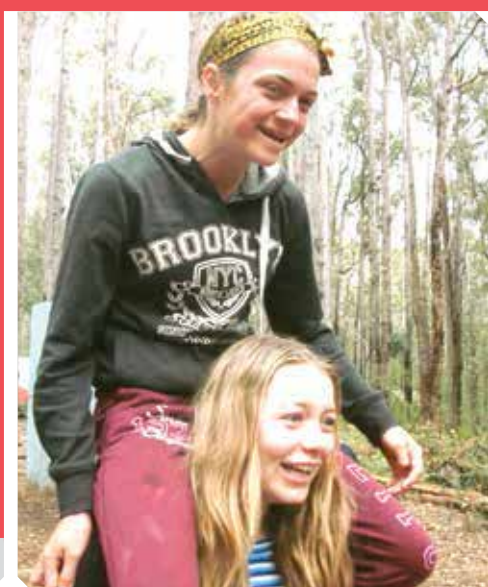

MATHEMATICS

2013 has again seen a busy year for the Mathematics Department at IMCC. The National Curriculum for Years 7, 8 and 9 is now fully implemented. While this continues to challenge many of our students, they have shown themselves to be willing and capable learners. These same year groups also now use electronic textbooks and are finding this to be a valuable resource, with many advantages over the traditional form of text.

In March, World of Maths came to the College and ran interactive sessions with the Year 7 students. All students spent 2 periods in the library working on problem solving tasks and developing skills that they will carry for life. Projects have been completed throughout the year looking at many different mathematics topics.

Year 7 created posters detailing their knowledge of a topic; Year 8 created film clips to teach percentages to other students and looked into how a prism surface area is found; Year 9 calculated household budgets and the cost of living; Year 10 looked at investing money, the spread of disease and how to use the sun to calculate heights; Year 11 researched the length of songs in different genres of music, and Year 12 ran simulations of different situations and looked at the probability of events occurring.

August saw 213 of our brightest mathematics students compete in the Australian Mathematics Competition. Well done to Katrina Boulton, Alicia Hanlon, Callaghan Bracken, Zoe Willson and Jesse Greenwood for achieving the highest result for their year group. All 5 received distinctions and placed in the top 10% of their age group nationally.

Did you know that Spanish is the first language in more than 20 countries?

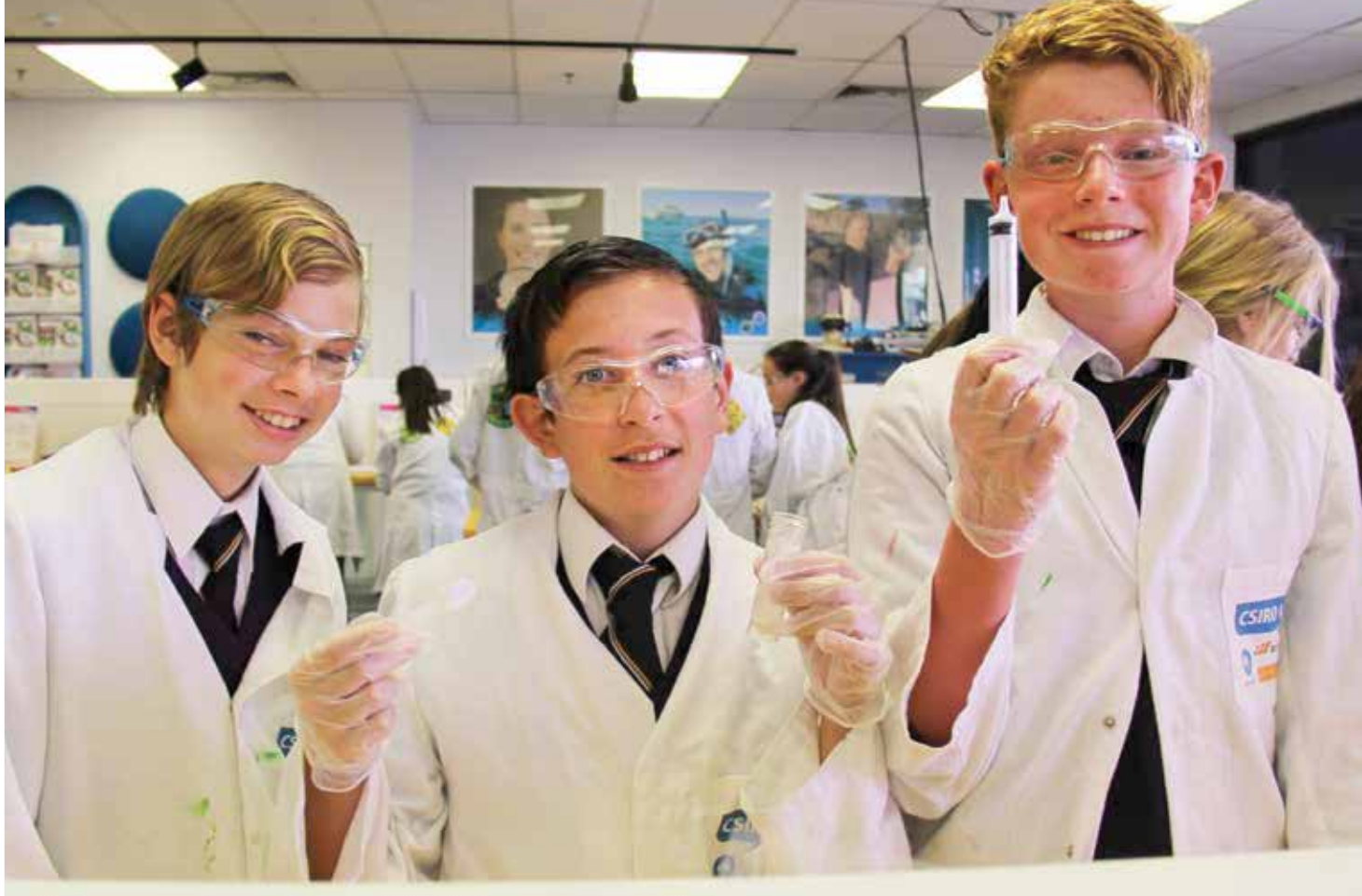
More than 450 million people worldwide speak Spanish. Furthermore, Spanish is the third most spoken language in the world after Mandarin Chinese and English!

CATHOLIC PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL

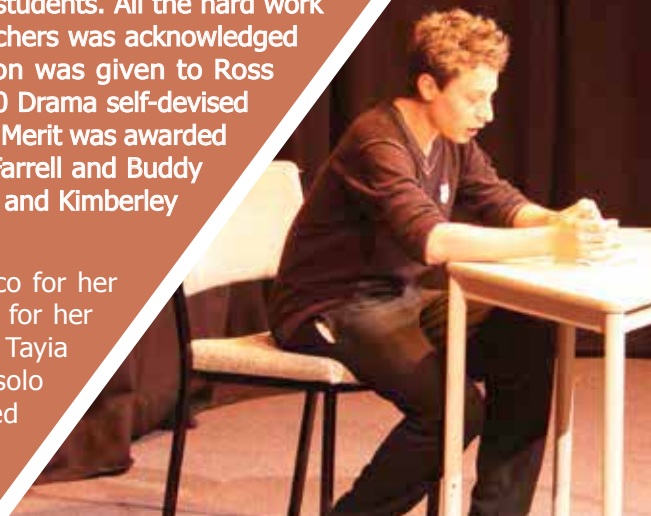

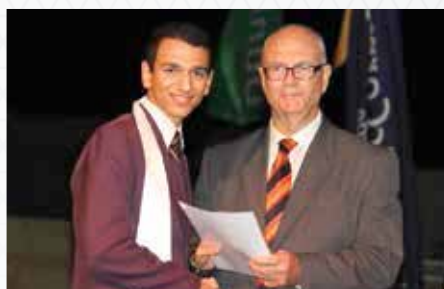


'Decay' by Guillermo Lopez

My artwork titled 'Decay' questions the strains that are put on our natural environment as a result of aspects of urbanisation. Focusing on one of Australia's most iconic waterways, I have explored the effects of the algae bloom on the Swan River catchment. My choice of medium and process of layering has been influenced by contemporary artist Belinda Fox. I explored her application of inks to produce a diverse range of transparent and opaque surfaces reflecting the changing quality of our waterways. The layers of motifs such as the hand and the subtle changes in tone, represent the runoff of fertilizers from agricultural areas resulting in the thousands of deaths of fish.

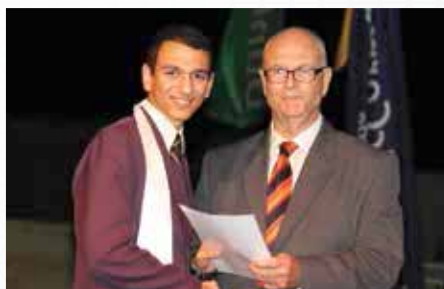

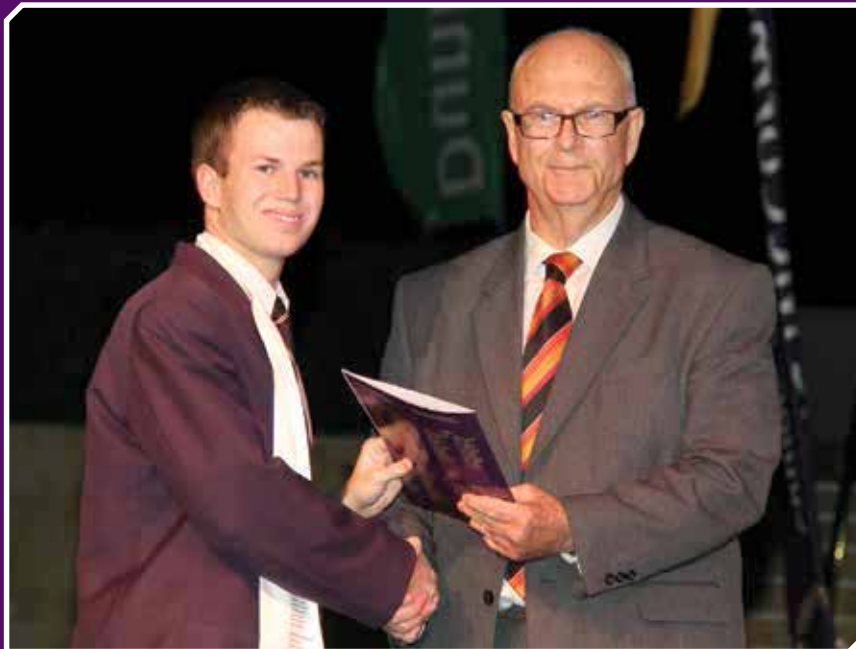
