PRINCIPAL

PRIOR TO JOINING, THE CONSISTENT MESSAGES I RECEIVED ABOUT OUR COLLEGE WERE THAT THE STAFF ARE VERY PASSIONATE ABOUT THE SCHOOL AND PROVIDE EXCELLENT CARE FOR THE STUDENTS, AND THAT THE STUDENTS ARE OF HIGH CALIBRE. I HAVE BEEN FORTUNATE TO EXPERIENCE THESE OUTSTANDING QUALITIES OF THE STAFF AND STUDENTS THIS YEAR.

Our College life this year has reflected the context of the Catholic education system three year strategic plan LEAD. The focus areas of Learning – Engagement – Accountability – Discipleship.

In the area of Learning the focus has been to further develop a culture of academic excellence and for each student to aspire to and strive for their full potential. The Curriculum has been developed to have increased Academic Extension classes in Years 7 to 10, with strategies in place for students requiring additional support with literacy and numeracy. Teachers have focused on implementing the new WA Curriculum courses for Year 11 in 2015 and Year 12 for 2016.

In the area of Engagement or community, our pastoral care structure will be extended to include Year 7, allowing for students to have the same Care Group Teacher from Year 7 through to graduation in Year 12. The Head of Year position will be extended to become a Dean of Year, with membership of the College executive. Deans of Year will have more time for the pastoral care of students.

In 2014 the College opened Irene's Cafe, a canteen to provide for the nourishment of students before school, recess and lunch times. The canteen has enabled the College to have the convenience to cater for all school events, rather than having to rely continually on the Home Economics and other staff, or to outsource catering.

In the area of Accountability, plans are in place for work to commence on a College gymnasium with provision for extending Outdoor Education, Music and Dance programs. Temporary classrooms will be



provided for the increased number of students. There will be enhancement to the Design and Technology facilities, as the College will extend the time students will be allocated for elective programs in Years 7, 8 and 9.

2014 has been a significant year for the College in the area of Discipleship, the Catholic Life of the College. Fr Robert Carrillo, Parish Priest of St Andrew's, Clarkson, was appointed College Chaplain which has enabled further development of the Liturgy and Sacramental programs. The College was proud to host Archbishop Timothy Costelloe and Bishop Don Sproston for the Catholic Schools Launch of the Perth Archdiocese LifeLink Appeal for Catholic welfare agencies. The College was also recognised by being awarded the Catholic Education Commission of WA LEAD Award for Discipleship for the outstanding Christian Service Learning Program and the College contribution to LifeLink.

The ongoing growth of the College, building on the excellent work of our foundation Principal Mr Paul Rafter, is only possible through the passion and effort of the College Board, with Chairperson Mrs Kerrie Carter, the College Executive and all staff, the families and students of the College. I extend my gratitude to all members of the College staff, all students and parents for their strong commitment, through personal effort and working in partnership, to enable our College be an outstanding Catholic learning community. ★

CHRISTIAN SERVICE LEARNING

EVERY DAY I AM BLESSED TO WITNESS THE GREAT WORK BOTH
STUDENTS AND STAFF CARRY OUT TO **SERVE** OTHERS.

Our Christian Service program ran again in Years 7, 9 and 11. Year 7 students completed a minimum of 20 varied activities, including the Brighton Catholic Primary Schools Buddies Program and helped Year 3 students with recycling projects. For the first time Year 7 students visited Quinns Rock Adult Day Centre and Bullwinkle Lodge at RAAFA. Students loved having the opportunity to spend time with some of the older members of our community, with many of them learning how to knit and play Rummy Cub.

Year 9 students had a huge year of Service completing a minimum of 20 hours in 2014. Students continued to help at Quinns Rock Adult Day Centre, St Vincent De Paul and Salvation Army clothing stores, and Bullwinkle Lodge. They also washed the Red Cross Soup Vans every Friday in Term 1.

Year 11 students worked on many projects

including fundraising for the homeless with the 40 Hours Without and Winter Sleepout. 35 staff and students volunteered at the City to Surf, manning the Marathon Recovery Tent. A dedicated team attended Merriwa Primary School Breakfast Club every Wednesday and Friday morning.

A new and very exciting partnership was formed with Manna Inc. An amazing organisation dedicated to helping the homeless and those in need. Students travelled every Friday to Manna Inc.'s kitchen to help prepare over 150 meals. This new project reflects the commitment the College has to Service and our aim to continue to develop new and exciting partnerships that are meaningful to our students and valuable to the wider community.

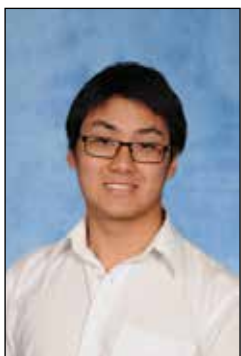

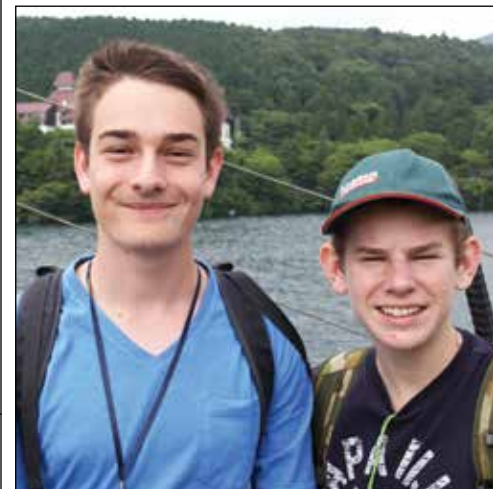
A hectic itinerary saw us visit Osaka, Mt Koyasan, Hiroshima, Kyoto, Mt Hakone and Tokyo.

I would like to thank all Rite Journey Mentors who have inspired our Year 9 students. ★

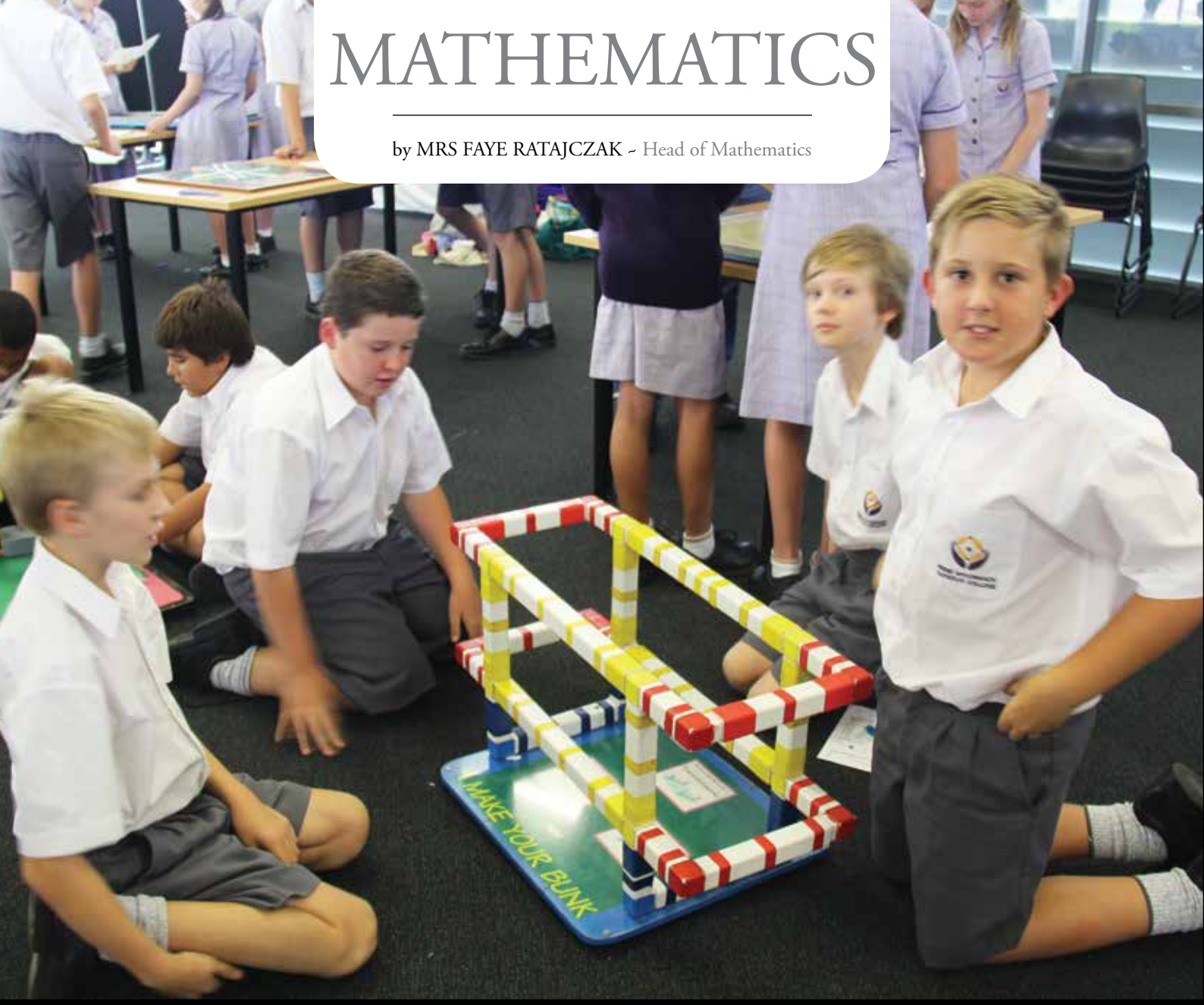

FOCUS THIS YEAR IN THE MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT.

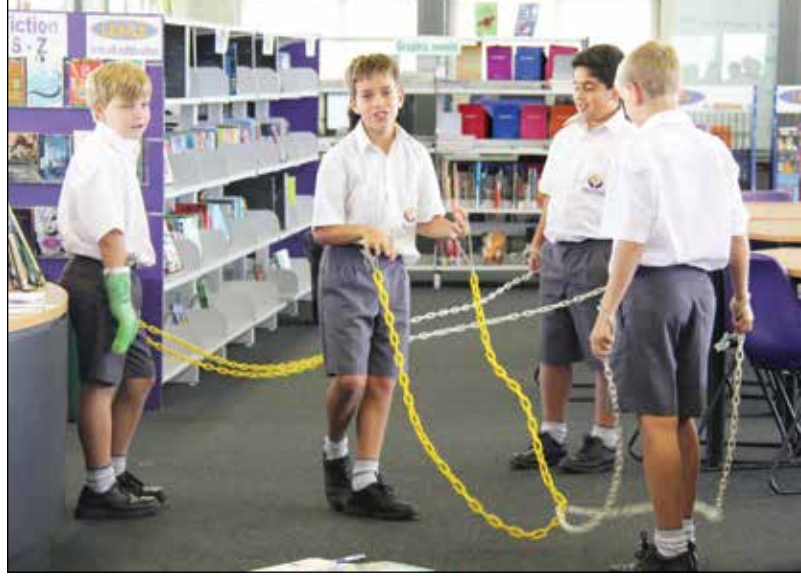
Our Year 10 students have been the first to cover this content each year since Year 7, and it was developed further with the introduction of an advanced class.

LISTENING, SPEAKING, READING AND WRITING.

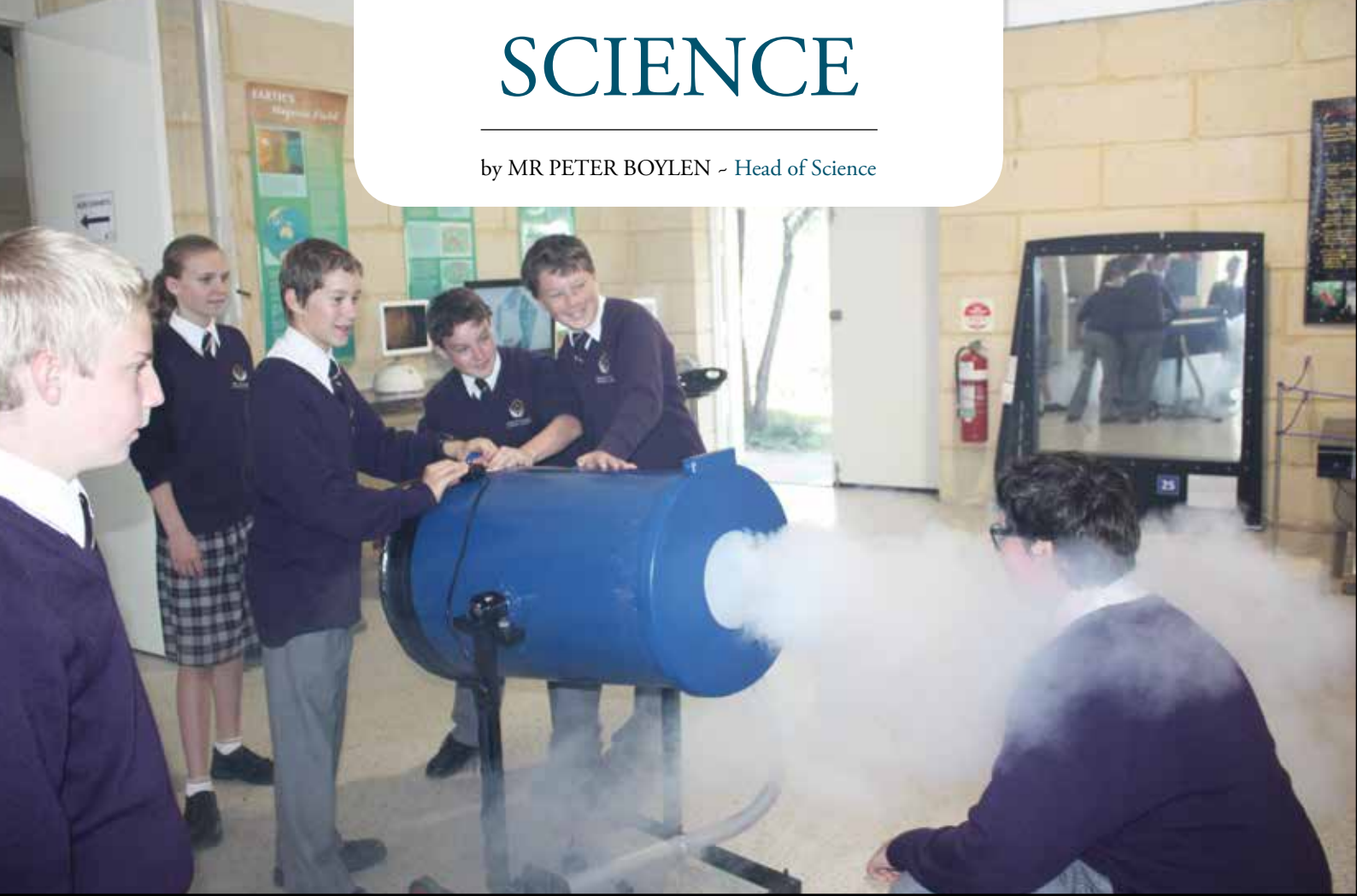

and tertiary sectors; vocational education and training onsite at school and at offsite locations; work experience; and counselling.

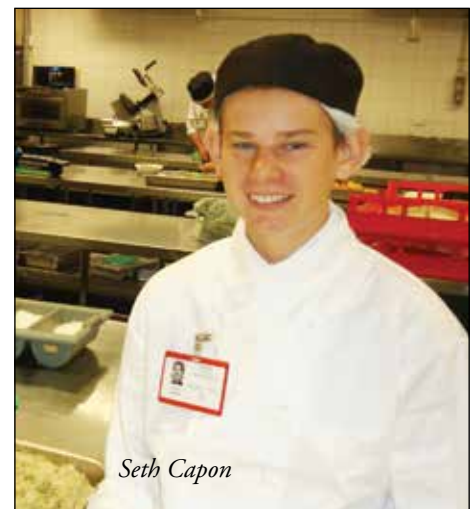

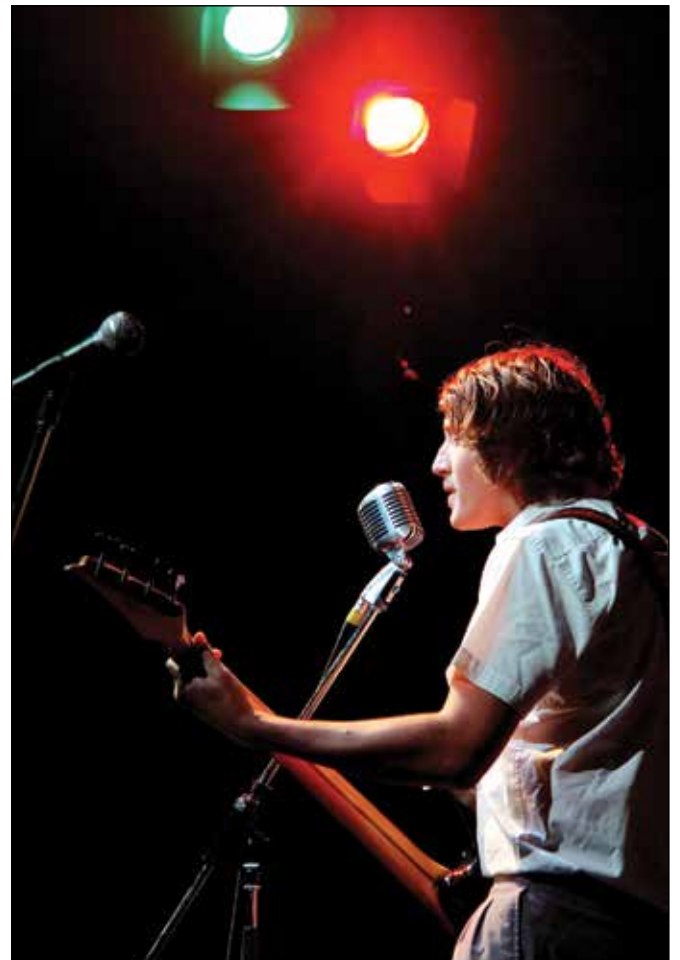
Sounds at Sunset was a relaxing way to perform to

Congratulations to all students and staff involved. I'm sure that IMCC's vivid participation in the Catholic Performing Arts Festival will remain strong for years to come. ★

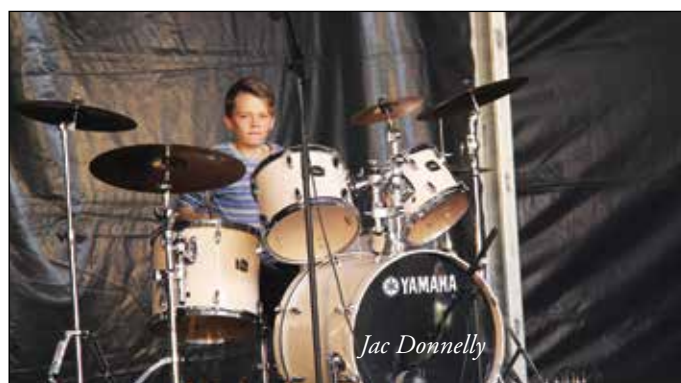
