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# PRINCIPAL



This year the College has undertaken the development of the 2016-2020 Strategic Plan. The strategic areas of the plan are Catholic Identity, Community, Education and Stewardship. The cornerstones of a vibrant Catholic school community.

Whilst looking ahead this year, there have been many achievements by students, staff and the wider College community to recognise and celebrate.

This year we have been fortunate to again have strong support from the wider Catholic community. Fr Robert Carrillo, St Andrew's Parish Priest and his assistants Fr Rainier, Fr Israel and Fr Jeffrey had a real presence, assisting with Mass, Retreats the Sacramental Program and generally being of spiritual support to staff and students. We congratulate the 14 students who received Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist and or Confirmation this year. We thank all students and staff who represented the College at St Andrew's Parish Masses during the year.

St Andrew's Parish, along with St Andrew's and Brighton Catholic Primary Schools offered Irene McCormack Catholic College Bursaries to members of their communities who will enter Year 7 in 2016. It is aimed that this will be an annual award.



A challenge for the College is playing a role with St Andrew's Parish and Brighton Catholic Primary, as the most northern Catholic organisations in the metropolitan area to develop the presence of the Catholic community in the areas to the north. How that will be undertaken, is further to be investigated with the Perth Archdiocese and the WA Catholic Education Commission.

Our Christian Service Learning Program continues to expand. An initiative this year was for seven staff members to visit Kururrungku Catholic Education Centre, Billiluna, in the Kimberley Region. The school serves approximately 100 Aboriginal students and adults who are mainly the Walmajarri people, with members of the Kukatja, Jaru and Walpiri people. Our aim is to promote teacher exchange and secondment programs between the schools, and develop a student and staff immersion program.

2016 is the 25th anniversary of Irene McCormack's death in Peru. The College, in collaboration with the Sisters of St Joseph, will develop an Irene McCormack Pilgrimage. This will focus on the places of importance in Irene's formation that led her to make a commitment to serve the village community in Peru. The students in the Year 10 Social Justice elective will be the first group to experience the Pilgrimage.

To further develop our pastoral care for students, each Year Group is represented by a Dean of Year on the College Executive. Care Group Teachers have the responsibility for one group of students entering Year 7 through to graduation in Year 12.

This year has been a transition year for aligning the academic year for all year groups. In recent years the academic program for Years 10, 11 and 12 commenced in October and the other year levels in February. Following a review of the arrangement it was decided that from 2016 Term 1 all year levels will have alignment with academic programs.



Our teaching staff have developed differentiated courses in Religious Education, English, Mathematics, Science and Social Sciences to cater for specific learning needs of students. From the first day of Year 7 the College has four levels: Academic Extension, Course 1, 2 and 3. Course 1 is a smaller class size to support students with special literacy and numeracy learning needs and along with Course 2 will provide students with a program towards achievement of literacy and numeracy requirements for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) Academic Extension. Course 3 is focused towards the preparation of students for the rigours of ATAR courses in Years 11 and 12.

In the traditional elective areas we have extended the time devoted for the courses. Year 7 students experience a semester of each course and from Year 8 students are able to select year long courses. This is aimed to broaden the students' skills, understandings and experience as they progress to the senior years. The College already provides an extensive range of courses for students wishing to pursue VET courses. In 2016 the College will provide elective courses for Year 10 students who desire to better prepare for Year 11 and 12 ATAR courses in Religious Education, Science and Social Sciences. These electives will enhance the regular programs in these learning areas.





In the last year we have experienced significant capital development to provide for the College's growing student population and the teaching and learning facilities. These projects include:

- The commencement of the new building with facilities for Physical and Outdoor Education, Music, Dance and Sport.
- The construction of five temporary classrooms.
- The Building and Construction workshop for Design and Technology.
- Extension of oval space particularly for Soccer, Rugby and additional space for Brighton Catholic Primary School students. We thank Brighton Catholic Primary School for the financial support for this project.
- Completion of the perimeter security fencing.
- Commencement of an access road for alternative access to the College.
- Transfer of the Uniform Shop to a more convenient location for access to the car park.
- Additional work preparation areas for teachers.

The enlarged Executive this year will enable the College to continue to improve the service and support to students and families in the future. The Executive is very ably supported by the Heads and Coordinators of Learning Areas, who this year have worked tirelessly to implement the new curriculum in Year 11 and other curriculum developments, the strategies to build the capacity of our teachers and utilisation of ICT.

Credit is given to all members of the Office, Accounts, Grounds and Maintenance, Canteen, Library, Uniform Shop and Teacher Assistants and Technicians for their wonderful support of our teachers and the development of facilities and services to make the students' learning experiences the best quality possible.

The primary focus of our school is to enable our students to learn and realise their potential to become fully contributing members of the local and global community when they graduate from the College. In this regard we recognise the outstanding contribution of our teachers to achieve this goal, whether it be in the class situation, extra-curricular programs or the casual conversations with students that take place each day.



This is year we recognise the efforts of two outstanding staff members who have contributed so much to the College for over a decade. # COLLEGE BOARD CHAIR

With approximately 960 students and 105 staff members associated with our school, Irene McCormack Catholic College is a large and complex organisation. The College has an annual budget this year of \$13 million and a capital budget of \$1 million.

A position on the College Board is a wonderful way for parents to get involved and help shape their child's school. I am privileged and honored to represent the College and Community. The Board, in representing the school community, actively promotes and supports the Catholic ethos of the College.

The general object for which the Board is constituted is to help the College fulfil its educational responsibilities in accordance with our Constitution, in accordance with the policies and practices prescribed or recommended by the West Australian Catholic Education Office (CEO), and in accordance with Diocesan guidelines and prescriptions for the Religious Education program.

The Board is responsible not only to the local College community, but also to the CEO for the financial administration of the College. It is also entrusted with the duty of planning, on behalf of the College community, with the staff (through the Principal) and with the CEO to meet the present and future needs of students.

Over the past year, our College has experienced a number of challenges, some significant changes, and many accomplishments.

The most obvious challenge has been the State Government funding realignment which interrupted a normal conclusion to the 2014 school year end for our team. Budget realignment was a challenge on everyone in our school system, and with the next election cycle promising further change, we must all continue to work towards identifying future challenges and to minimise impact to our deliverables.

Despite these challenges, the past year is still noteworthy for many positive accomplishments.

In 2013 the Board approved as a component of the College's Long-Term Facility Plan, a proposal to build a new gymnasium. The development will deliver to the College community advanced and state of the art sporting and performing arts facilities. Following a prompt, yet robust tender process, we awarded the contract in early 2015 and one of the most enjoyable tasks of the day while delivering my children to school is witnessing the daily progress this project has enjoyed this year. The project remains on track for completion and commissioning mid-2016.

During 2015 the College embarked on a number of other activities and projects to improve our campus. Some of the highlights are; five new classrooms (with landscaping and new locker areas), re-location of the Uniform Shop, refurbishment of the former Uniform Shop as a Science teacher's preparation area, development of a Building and Construction building for Design and Technology, upgrade of the College IT network including the Wi-Fi capacity and significant grounds work clearing the south embankment and the land on the east side of the campus which now provides additional oval space and visually looks stunning.

Our students continue to excel in many areas. These include academics, sports, music and theatre.

# CAMPUS MINISTRY

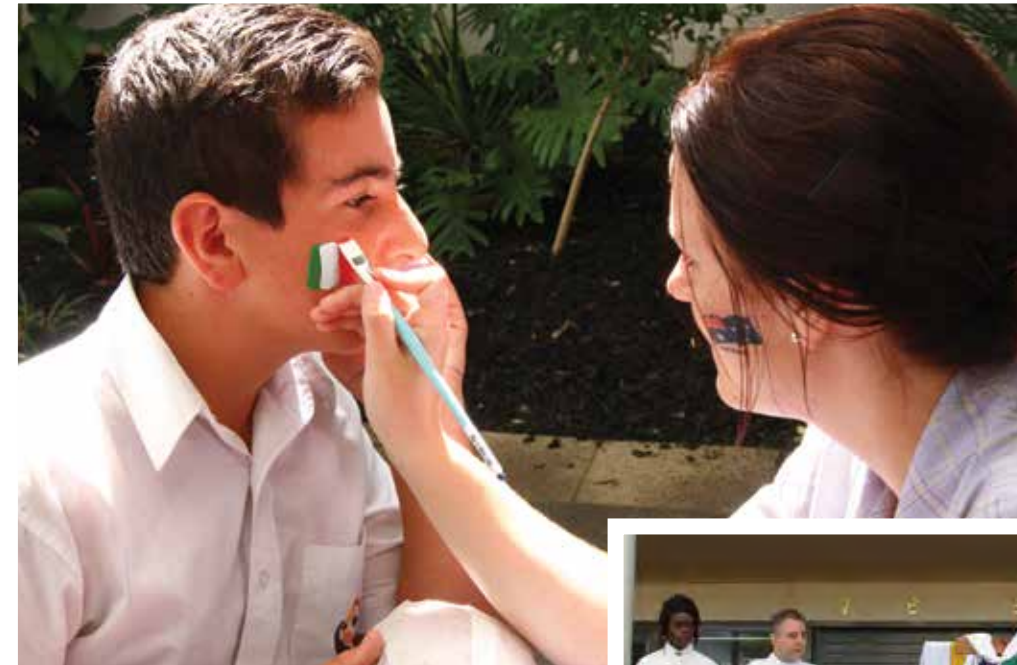

# SKI TRIP

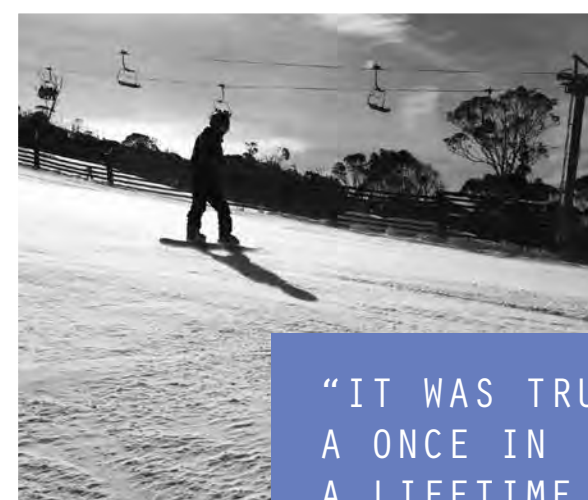


The Ski Trip was truly a once in a lifetime opportunity, allowing us to grow closer as a year group and experience the snow, the first time for most of us.

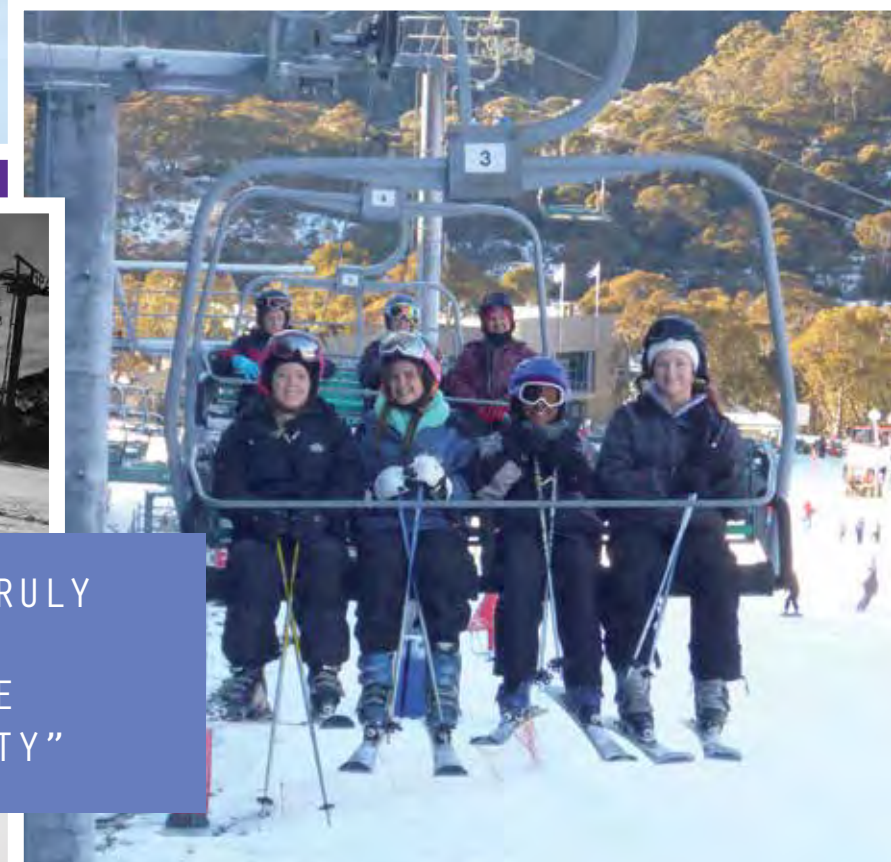

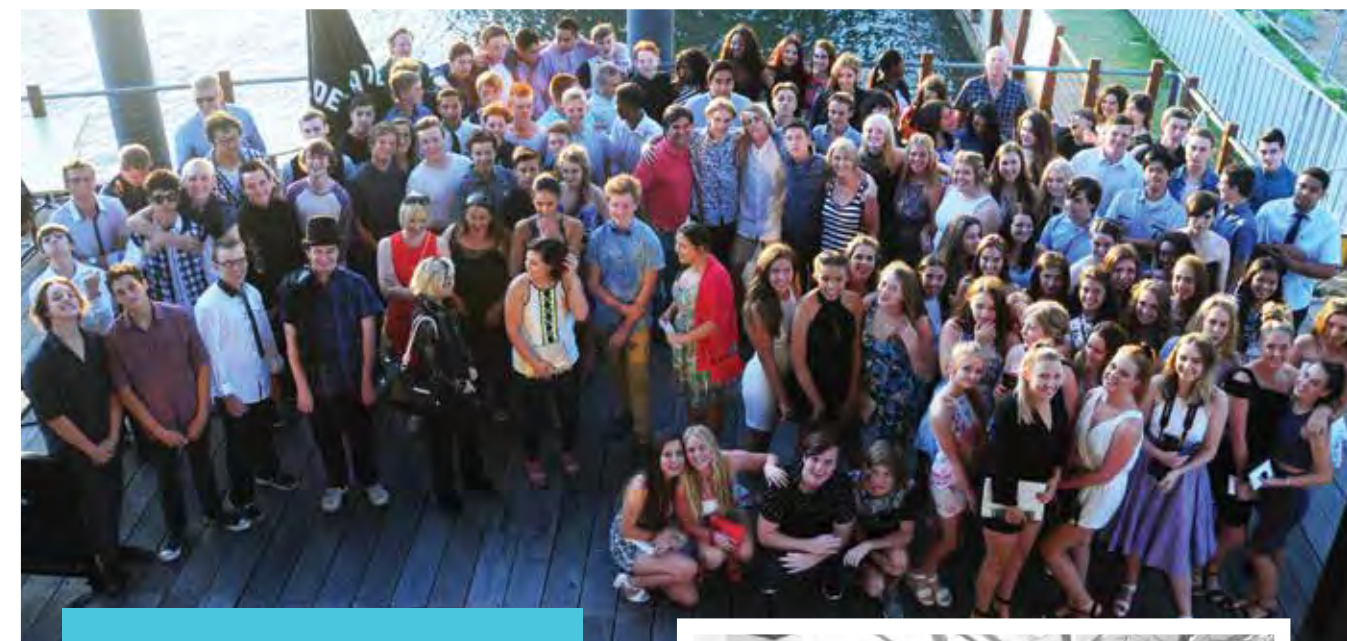
It has been personally rewarding to work with the Year 11 cohort this year. Their contribution to the College through their many gifts and talents has been outstanding.

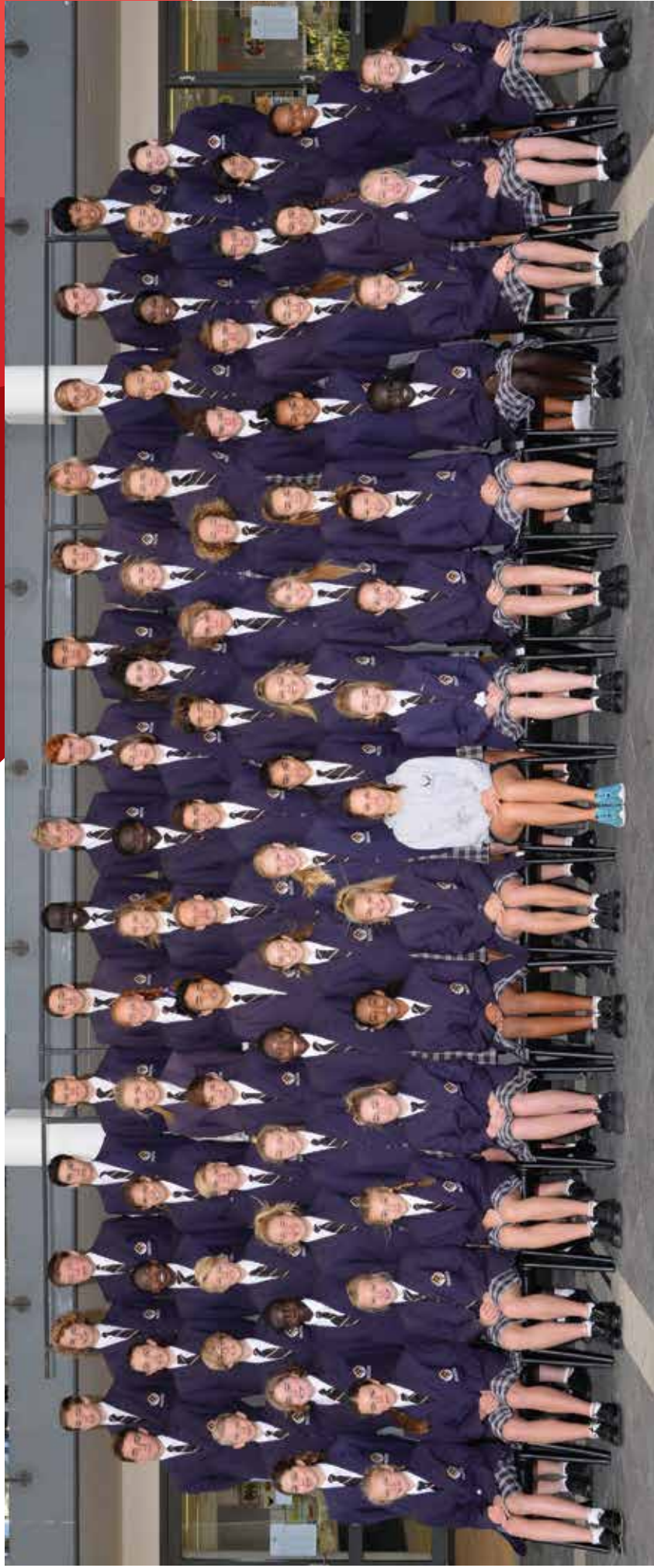

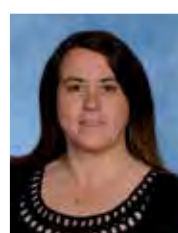

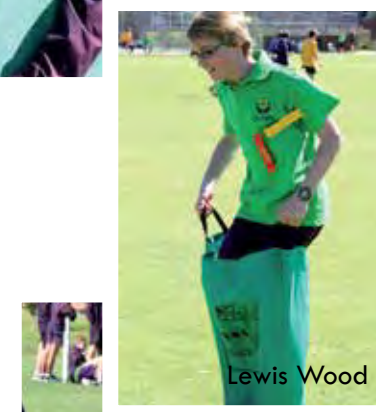

Mrs Smith, Dean of Year 7, supported the program with her Care Group teachers and assisted in providing a valuable pastoral care program for our Year 7 students.

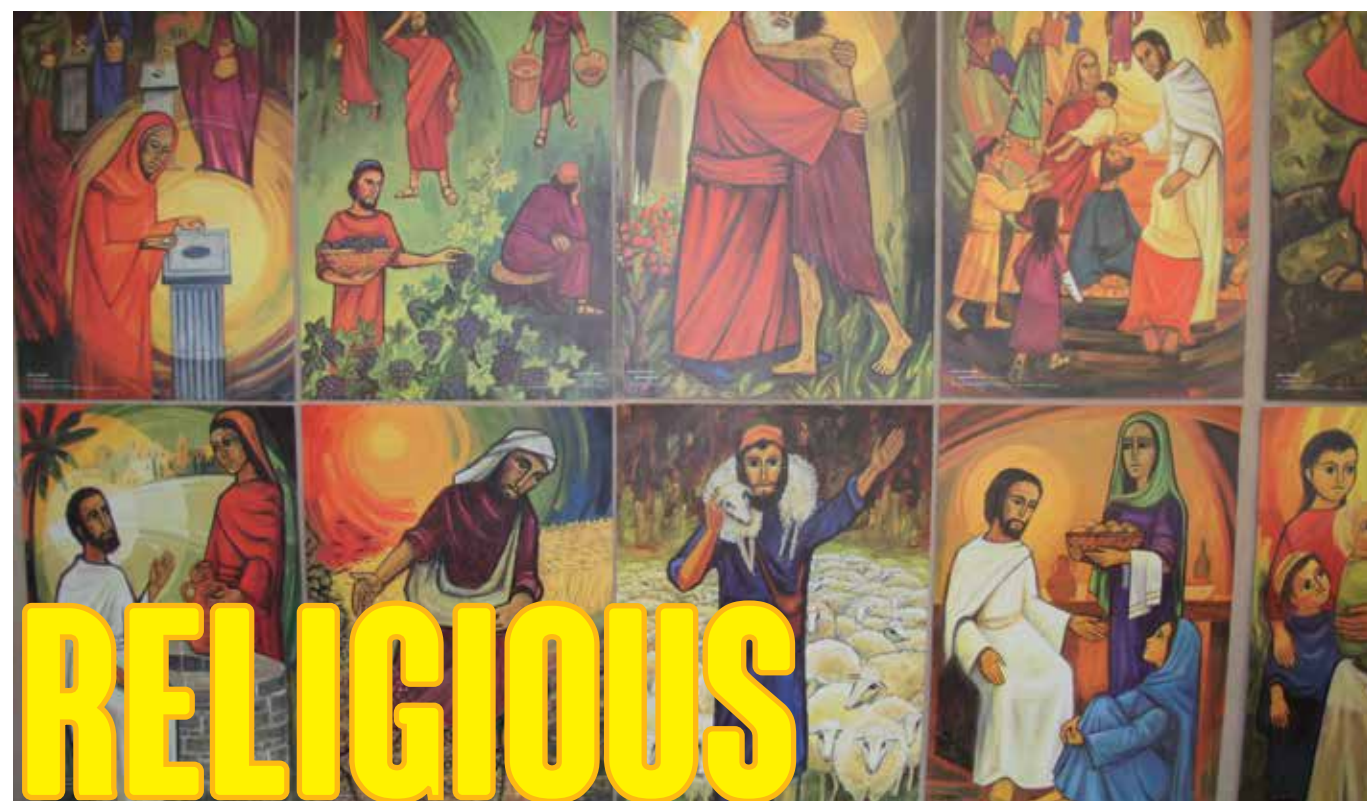

# MATHEMATICS

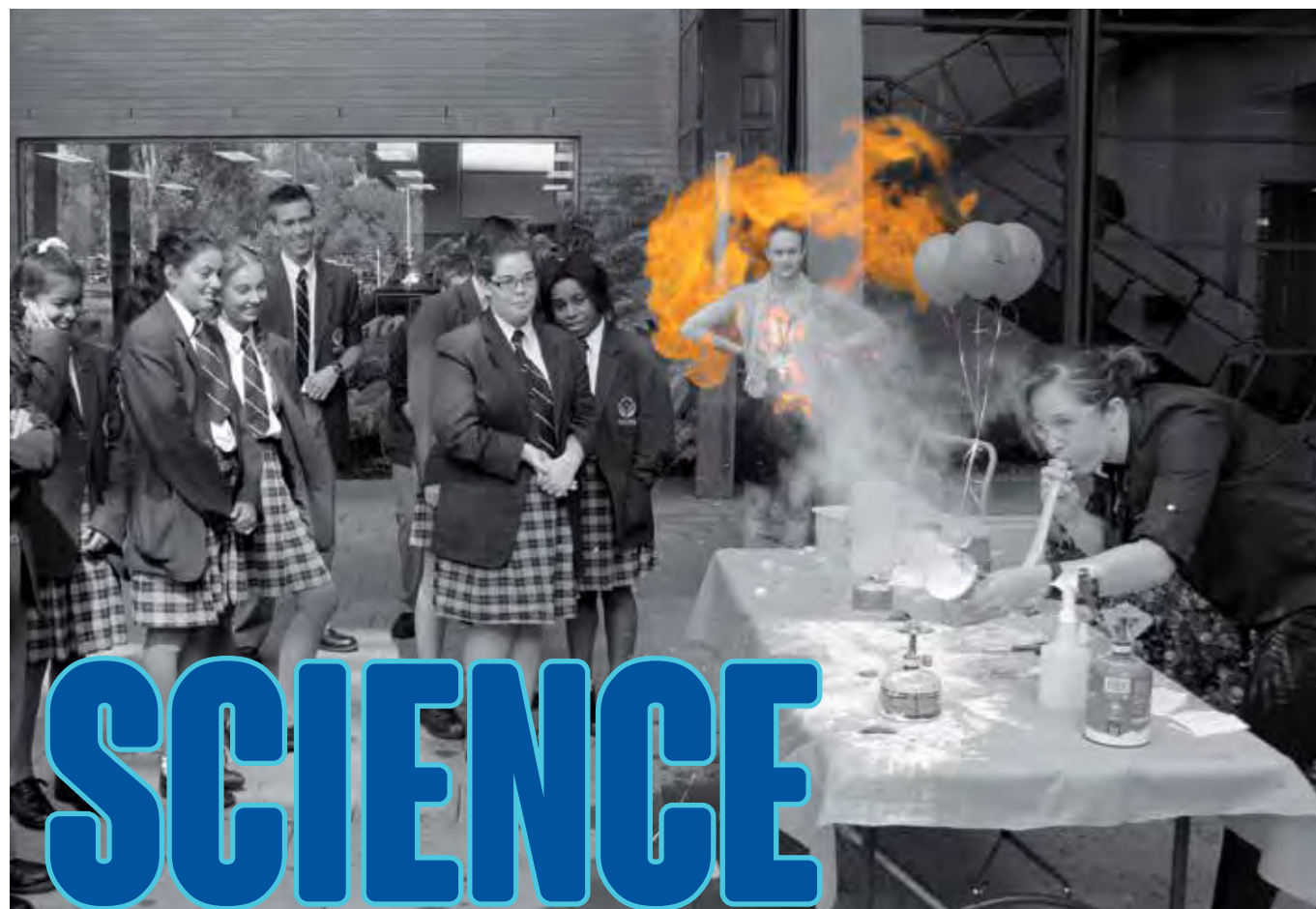
The year began last October with the implementation of the new Senior School Curriculum. Staff worked to develop and program the new courses in the best possible way for students in Year 11. This year we welcomed Mr Michael Geddes, and Mr John Mirco joined us for Terms 3 and 4. Once again, the Year 7 students participated in “World of Maths” activities at the College in Term 2. The instructions and questions on the displays make each session a guided discovery lesson, where the students solve a variety of problems, discover number patterns, identify geometric properties, think logically and apply mathematics to the physical world.

NAPLAN results showed an improvement in Numeracy for 2015 with both Years 7 and 9 at the National average. We will use this data to help further develop programs and strategies to improve. Finally, thank you to both Mr John Power and Mr Liam Rafferty for their invaluable contributions to the Mathematics Department over the years.

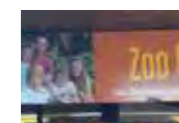

A grant of \$23,000 was awarded by CEOWA Centres for Excellence in Languages to start up the French program so that, by 2019, we will have our first Year 12 French ATAR class.

I would like to thank the wonderful English team, whose dedication and enthusiasm for English allows them to illuminate the minds of our students.

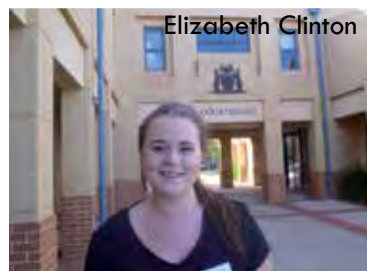

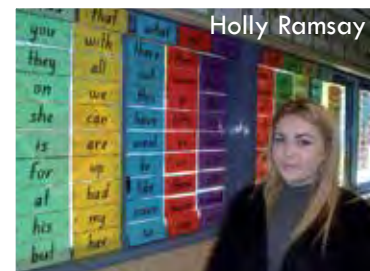

It has been an eventful year in Design & Technology. At the beginning of the year we welcomed two new teachers to the Department, Mr McHale and Mr Warren, who quickly discovered the talents of our students in Woodwork, Metalwork, Building & Construction and Graphic Design. Some outstanding projects have been produced in the senior Woodwork class where students designed and created a mix of traditional and modern furniture under the guidance of Mr Williams. A culmination of skills in Metalwork has shown an array of divergent thinking and interesting metalwork projects including lamps, tables, fire pits and a portable BMX rail.

The Department continues to grow with the addition of a Building & Construction Shed completed at the end of Term 2. Students have put this area to good use with the construction of cubby houses, brick barbeques and a pergola.

Students in Years 7 to 9 have developed foundation skills in computer design, basic hand skills and have had exposure to various power tools. Added to the curriculum this year was the use of 3D printing, with Year 7 Design & Technology students drawing and printing small plastic items. The Department is focused on moving forward with technology and has purchased a laser cutter. A new course available next year in Dimensional Design will allow students to combine the use of 3D Printing and Laser cutting to design and produce items that have not been possible with traditional techniques.

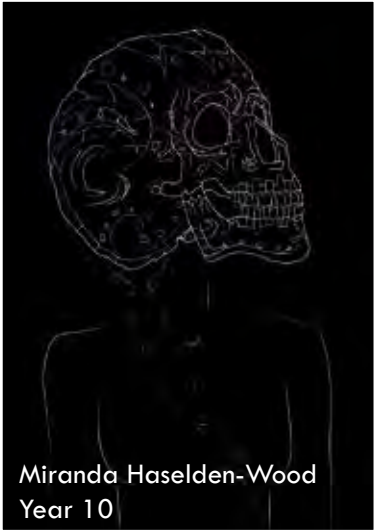

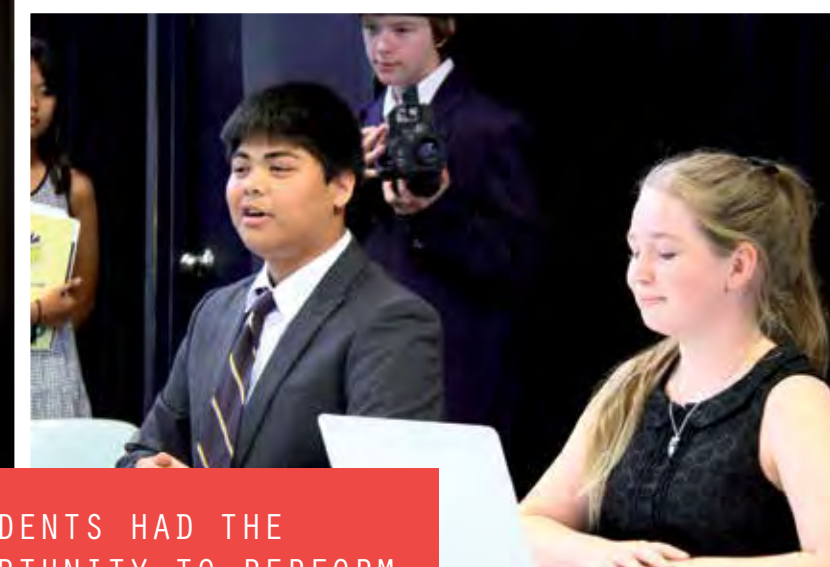

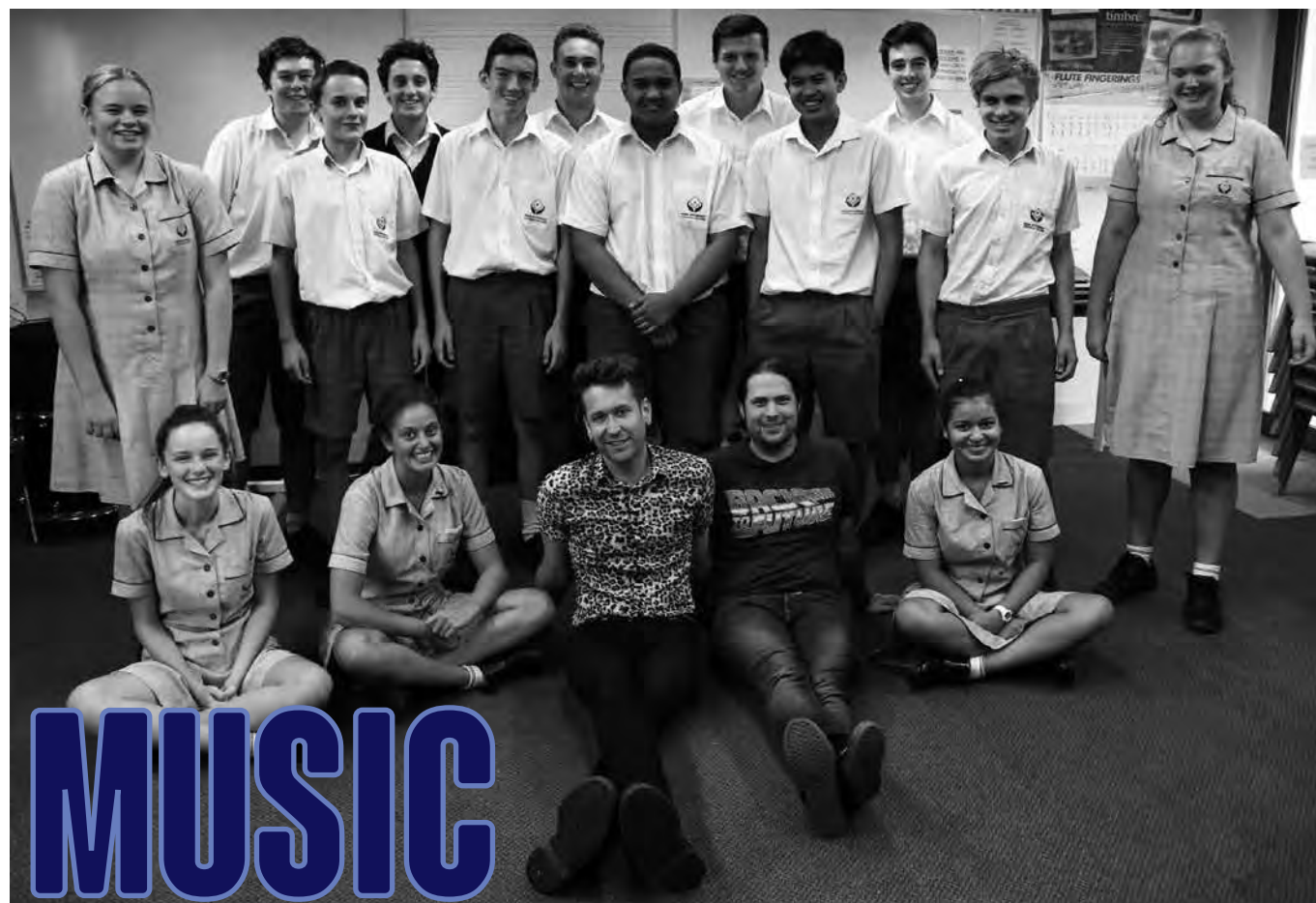

# LIVE MUSIC



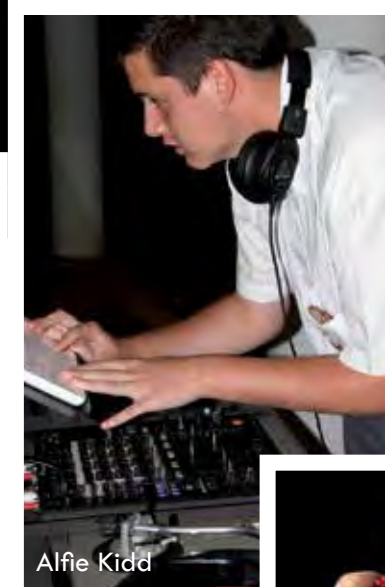

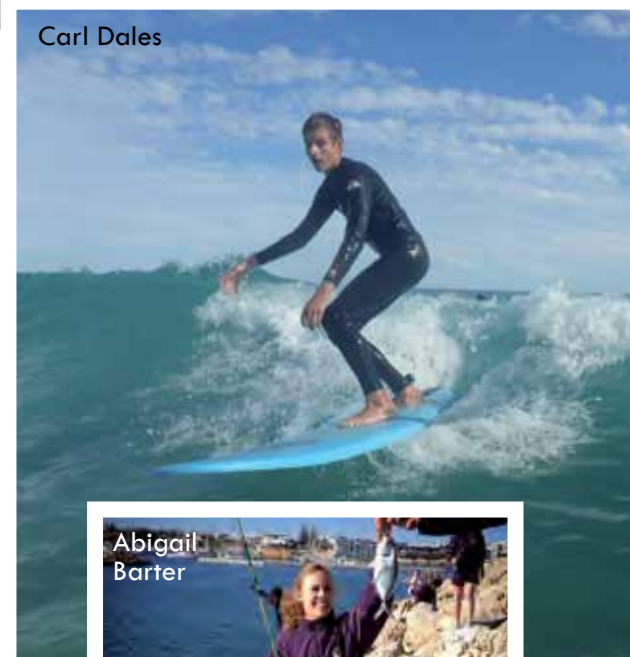




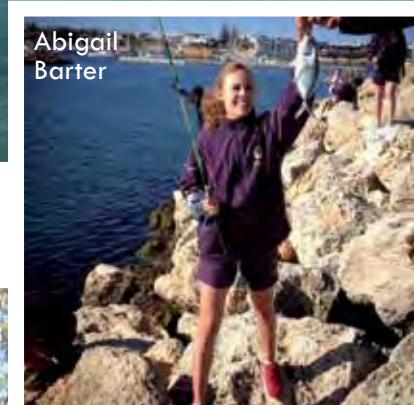
# OUTDOOR EDUCATION

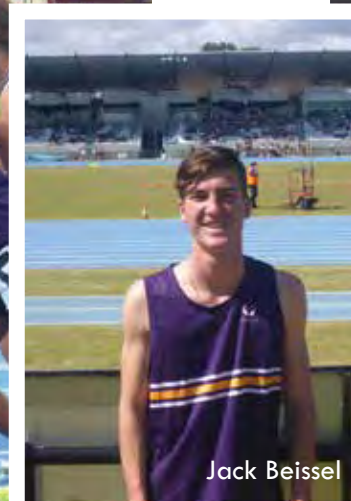
# ACC ATHLETICS

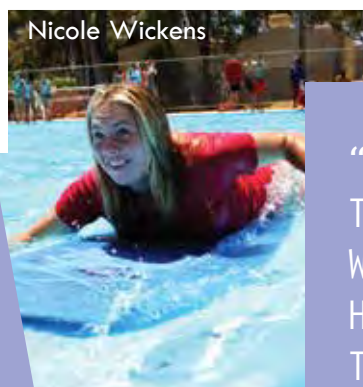

# THE RESURRECTED IRENE



The cut-glass icon is a symbolic narrative of the life of Sr Irene McCormack, Sister of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart. Sr Irene was murdered on 21/5/91 with four significant villagers in the town square of Huasahuasi, a little village in the Andes Mountains of Peru by members of the paramilitary group, The Shining Path.

The central figure in the icon is the resurrected, dancing, free Sr Irene. The red dress represents her religious habit, the blood of martyrs and the colour of her favourite football team, South Fremantle. The gold emblem attached to the dress is the emblem worn by the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, and touched Irene's grave in Peru. The wheat in the lower left of the icon represents the parents and siblings of Irene. The missing leaf signifies Irene and is placed above her head. The golden rays signify the bursting into new life of the resurrected Irene. The blue pathway on the left is the life and journey of Irene before she went to Peru in 1987 and the tree of life on the right of the icon is Irene's theological and spiritual journey. The green glass represents the birthplace of Irene in 1938 in the wheat belt of Western Australia. The chalice-shape above the rocks is the fountain in the middle of the plaza (two broken rocks) where Irene and the men were murdered. The men are represented by the four grey rocks at the foot of the icon. The red and blue flowing from the chalice represent the blood and the waters of life. The figures in the icon are the women and children of Peru. The icon is set in jarrah wood from Manjimup, WA, where Sr Irene was principal of the local Catholic Secondary School. The imagery in the icon is rich in meaning. Meditating before it the viewer is once more swept into the whole paschal mystery.
