# PRINCIPAL

2017 has presented challenges for many families of the College. The Western Australian economy has impacted on the state and growth in our area has slowed. Many families have faced struggles that had not previously been experienced. Despite this, families, staff and the wider College community have supported students to achieve notable success.

When the school year commenced we celebrated the success of the Class of 2016 achieving above state average results and our highest number of School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) Awards. This year's NAPLAN results have been the best achieved by Year 7 and 9 students, particularly in numeracy and writing. Significant improvement was also made with the Year 9 Bishop's Religious Literacy Assessment results.

The College community appreciates the continued excellent support from the wider Catholic community, especially from Fr Robert Carrillo, St Andrew's Parish Priest and his Assistant Priest, Fr Israel Quirit. Fourteen students received Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist and or Confirmation this year. Irene's Service Learning Program continues to offer more opportunities for students and staff. In July, following the second immersion tour experience



for Years 11 and 12 students at Kururrungku Catholic Education Centre, Billiluna, in the Kimberley Region, the College hosted a return visit of the Billiluna students and staff.

The College introduced new courses for Fashion and Textiles, and extended the Football and Soccer Academies with Sport and Recreation Cert II courses in Years 11 and 12. In 2018 the College will introduce Japanese in Years 7 and 8, and Photography in Years 8 and 9 to the curriculum, with the plan to extend the programs into Years 11 and 12.

The Mary MacKillop Medals were presented for the first time this year. These awards are in honour of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, the founder of Sr Irene's order, The Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Medals are presented to Year 12 students at the Graduation Ceremony for sustained excellence for academic achievement and for Learning Attributes. Leah Ayres was the recipient of both awards this year.

In the extra-curricular program which includes Sport, Performing Arts and other areas, our students continue to excel. Of note this year is the best overall results by our Performing Arts students in the Catholic Performing Arts Festival.

The College continued to provide improved facilities this year. Additional classrooms were opened, Student Services Centre opened with offices for the College Psychologist, Aboriginal Liaison Officer, Vocational Education Coordinator and Careers Counsellor. The Mary MacKillop Centre was reopened, and new offices were created for the Deputy Principal, Deans of Year, Science and Mathematics staff, Accounts, Principal's PA and the waiting area. Improvements were implemented for the car park, providing improved student pick up and drop off zones.

Our College continues to strive to provide increased opportunities and level of care for the development of our students. I extend sincere gratitude to all for their wonderful efforts. To the College Board members, with Chairperson Mr Chris Erikson, for the oversight of the College financial and capital programs. The Parent



Group, with Chairperson Mrs Hanneley Tredoux, has given excellent support to students. The Parent Group assisted with the hospitality at events, including the memorable and emotional Mass and Graduation Ceremony for our Year 12 students, organisation of a parent forum addressing cyber safety issues and funding of the project to improve the undercroft area.

The College is fortunate to have staff of high calibre. I thank Mr John Swindells, Deputy Principal in Semester 2 following Ms Nancy Bonfiglio's appointment with a position with Catholic Education Western Australia for the implementation of the digital technologies, and the members of the Executive who provide excellent leadership in the faith, pastoral and academic dimensions for students, ably supported by the Care Group teachers. The Executive is very ably supported by the Heads and Coordinators of Learning Areas, who this year have overseen the continued implementation of the Western Australian curriculum and the continued utilisation of digital technologies for learning. I extend gratitude to all members of the Administration, Finance, Grounds and Maintenance, Canteen, Library, Uniform Shop, Teacher Assistants and Technicians, for their wonderful support of our teachers, and the development of facilities and services to make the students' learning experiences the best quality possible.

We congratulate and thank the members of the Class of 2017 for their excellent achievements, service and leadership of the College. We wish for our graduating students, success and a spirit to tackle the challenges that life presents. We encourage our graduates to go out into the local, national and global communities to make our world a better place and to use the words of the College motto "Prayer, Service and Justice as the guiding light" of their daily lives. Notwithstanding the challenge of an evolving and transitioning economy, we must and will remain committed to creating stability. The Board respectfully acknowledges the financial difficulties faced by many families and the College's endeavour to assist them. The Board will

continue to collaborate with the Catholic Education Commission to ensure alignment.

In support of maintaining a strong financial position, the Board has responded by establishing a Finance sub-committee to deliver additional ongoing support, provide financial oversight for the College with budgeting and financial planning, financial reporting, and the creation and monitoring of internal controls and accountability policies.

In relation to Board undertakings, a strong focus has remained on the College's Long-Term Facility Plan. During 2017 the College embarked on a number of refurbishments and improvements carried out to classrooms, learning area and administration offices, Student Services, Campus Ministry, Religious Education and the MacKillop Centre. None of these items could have been accomplished without the contribution of our Parent Group and many of our staff maintaining our College grounds and facilities in excellent working order.

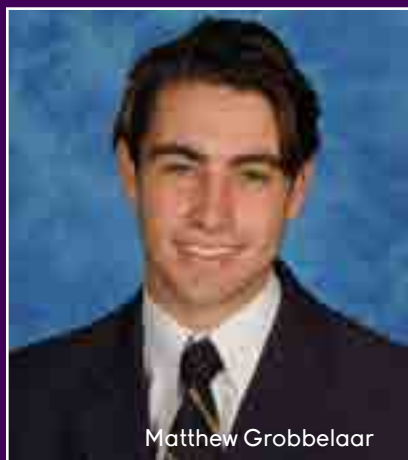

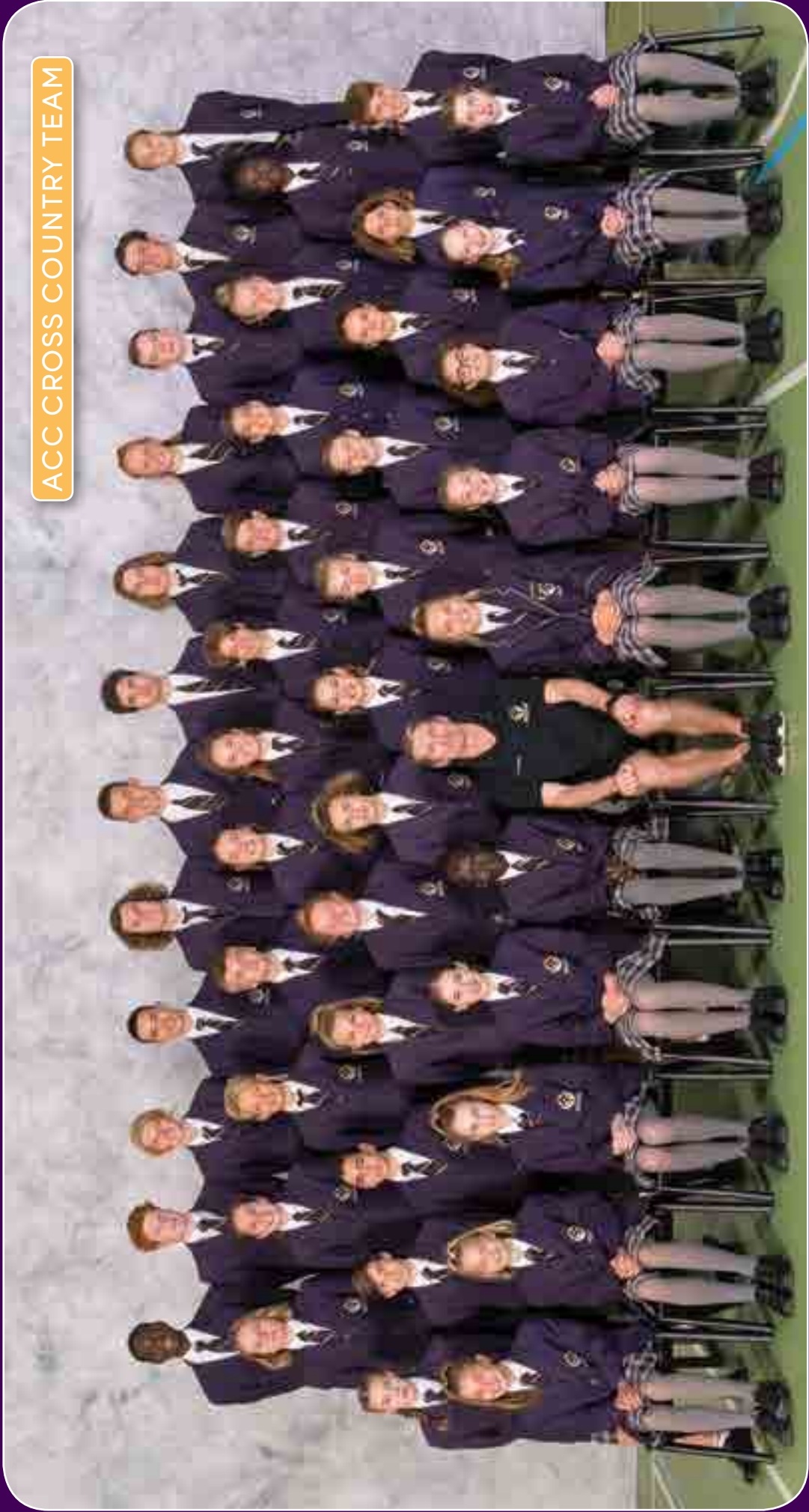

# PEER SUPPORT



When we support other people, we are also looking after ourselves. The Catholic ideal of 'loving your neighbour as yourself' is put into practice with the College Peer Support Program. This year, we have 36 Year 11 Peer Support Leaders who give up their time to mentor the Year 7 students during extended care each Tuesday. The sessions involve icebreaker, 'getting to know you' activities which allow fun and supportive interaction between two different age groups. The Year 11 students received peer mentoring training last year and in addition meet three times a term at lunchtime to receive additional training. This year the Mathematics Department implemented Mathspace for all our students, especially those in Years 7 to 10. Mathspace is an online adaptive mathematics program that allows staff to set specific and customised curriculum tasks for classes. It provides students with instant and guided feedback on every question they answer. All student input is recorded and staff have been able to use this in planning lessons, catering for student strengths and weaknesses, and preparing classes for assessments. The benefits to our students' learning have been substantial.

A Mathematics elective for Year 10 students was also introduced this year. Specialist Mathematics in Year 10 aims to develop our highest academic students beyond the Year 10 and 10A curriculum. It introduces, by discovery, concepts that students will encounter in the Year 11 Specialist and Methods courses. The course has also seen the students complete two extensive research assignments about future careers that involve the study of tertiary mathematics, and famous mathematicians and their contribution to current mathematics studies.

This year has seen our students benefit from an extensive range of out-of-school learning and training opportunities. Five Year 10 students participated in The Get Real Experience and Try (GREaT) Nursing and Midwifery Program, gaining first-hand experience at Royal Perth Hospital. Students have elected to take part in try-a-trade programs that expose them to a variety of trades, to get a taste of a particular industry of interest. Year 11 and 12 students attended TAFE externally in courses including Building and Construction, Data and Voice Communications, Beauty Services, Automotive, Hairdressing, Commercial Cookery and Mobile Plant Technology.

Through our Workplace Learning partner, Onsite, Year 11 and 12 students gained work experience in a variety of areas including real estate, carpentry, plumbing, electrical, retail, hospitality, sign writing, security installation, agriculture, mechanics, childcare, education and aged care. These programs available to our students introduce them to the variety of career pathways available to them, as well as developing core employability and interpersonal skills so highly regarded for future training and employment. Many Year 12 students have gained employment through our workplace learning programs.

Students across the years have received presentations related to post-school options from universities, TAFE and other organisations. Seminars have been offered in developing career portfolios, applications to a variety of programs/scholarships and course selection. Career counselling has been invaluable for students to investigate the many possible pathways and opportunities available to them.

We continue to develop our relationship and network with the local business community by being a member of the Wanneroo Business Association (WBA). Our WBA Sundowner held in July saw WBA members, local and family run businesses, gather together for an evening of entertainment and networking. By developing greater links with community, we are strengthening our Workplace Learning Program and developing partnerships with industry to provide authentic experiences for our students in our VET programs.

It has been one of our most productive years in Design and Technology yet. The standard of work produced by students across all our courses has been exceptionally high. This year, Design and Technology has included courses in Building and Construction, Dimensional Design, Graphic Design, Metalwork and Woodwork, as well as our two extracurricular activities Maker Space and the Electric Vehicle Challenge.

Building and Construction students have completed numerous projects around the College including coloured concrete pavers which were used for a giant chess board, concrete paths, cubby houses, picnic tables, and a courtyard renovation by the senior students.

Dimensional Design and Maker Space students have been putting the 3-Dimensional printers and laser cutter to good use. Students have used various types of software such as Fusion 360, Tinker Cad and Adobe Illustrator to design and make articles such as laser cut lanterns, scaled models of shipping container homes, and 3D printed items including USB sticks and small plastic figurines.

Students in Graphic Design compiled an impressive range of computer generated illustrations. Using Photoshop and Adobe Illustrator, students created graphics that ranged from comic styled rock stars, geometric animals, sugar skulls, posters and corporate logos.

Upper school classes have produced some standout projects in woodwork and metalwork. In metalwork, there were a variety of toolbox styles and park bench designs. In woodwork, the quality of furniture produced was amazing and ranged from hall stands, shoe boxes and bar tables.

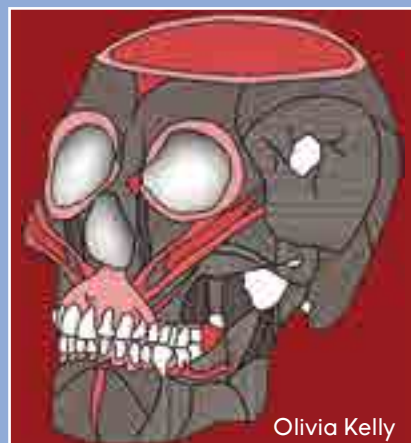

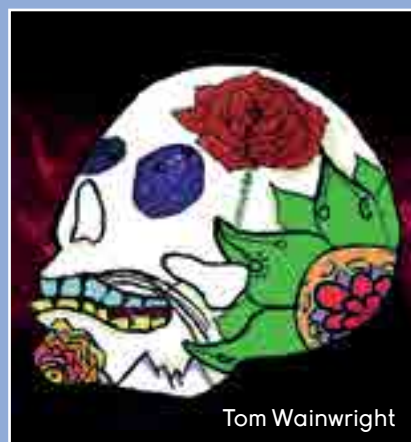

# MARY MacKILLOP MEDALS

## FOR EXCELLENCE AND ACHIEVEMENT

Sr Irene McCormack's profession as a Sister of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart was on the 6th January, 1959, the feast of the Epiphany. The order was founded by Australia's first saint, Mary MacKillop.

To help our community learn more about St Mary MacKillop and to promote her strong commitment to education, the Mary MacKillop Medal is awarded annually to Year 12 students at their Mass for Graduation and Ceremony. These awards are for exceptional student achievement, requiring excellence and consistency in every course, for years 7 to 12.

There are two categories for the medal. The Mary MacKillop Medal for Achievement is for the Year 12 students who achieve or closest to all "A" grades for all courses from Year 7 to Year 12. The Mary MacKillop Medal for Excellence is for the development of personal life skills, and is awarded to Year 12 students who achieve consistently for the learning attributes in all, or closest to all, courses in Year 7 to Year 12 and excellent for the Care Group Teachers criteria.

Mary MacKillop's parents migrated from Scotland and Mary was born in Victoria in 1842. She was the eldest of eight children. Mary started work at the age of 14 to support her family. At the age of 18 Mary moved to Penola in South Australia and commenced educating local children. Mary MacKillop, together with Rev Julian Tenison Woods, founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, affectionately known as the 'Josephites' or 'Brown Joey's'. She was a teacher, and attracted to the order many teachers. In 1867 Mary became the first ordained Sister of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Sr Mary, with the help of many others, established schools in most Australian states, including St Joseph's in Trayning where Sr Irene spent her childhood. Mary MacKillop's life story and legacy, is a model of faith, commitment, dedication, perseverance and longevity to live out her dream and aspirations.

Her life was an inspiration to many people, including Irene McCormack.

The 2017 Mary MacKillop Medal for Excellence and the Mary MacKillop Medal for Achievement are presented to Leah Ayres.
