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Principal



The school year commenced with a celebration of the success of our Class of 2017. This included achieving above state average results, students achieving entry to university and TAFE or apprenticeships and traineeships, and Leah Ayres achieving the highest ATAR score in the College's history. This year's NAPLAN results have been the best achieved by Year 7 and 9 students, particularly in numeracy and writing.

The College community appreciates the continued excellent support from the wider Catholic community, especially from Fr Robert Carrillo, St Andrew's Parish Priest and his assistant Fr Konrad Gagatek. This year, ten students received Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Irene's Service Learning Program continues to offer more opportunities for students and staff. This year the College has developed partnerships with MercyCare in Merriwa, with our students assisting with Homework Club and gardening.

This year the College introduced two new courses. The Western Australian Curriculum requires that languages be compulsory in all year levels up to Year 8 by 2023. The College introduced Japanese for Years 7 and 8, giving students an alternative to French and photography in Years 8 and 9. It is an aim that both courses will be developed to be available through to Year 12 in the future.

The College was one of the first schools to successfully undertake NAPLAN in digital format. Students completed the assessment on their own laptops. The success reflected the significant progress with utilising digital technology for learning. In Years 7 to 10, students generally use digital 'text books' in Mathematics, Science and Social Sciences. Student feedback includes that they "cannot imagine not having a laptop for learning", appreciate having text resources in digital format, but still need to use handwriting at least half the time to assist their learning.

Our students continue to excel in the extra-curricular program, including Sport, Performing Arts and other areas. Following the improvement of previous years, this year saw the best overall results by our Performing Arts students in the Catholic Performing Arts Festival. Creations Exhibition for Art and Technology continues to grow, with attendance at the Opening Night reaching record numbers. In Sport, the ACC Cross Country team was a stand-out for improvement with the College in the top 25% of schools.



The College continued to provide improved facilities this year. Of note are the renovations to the Drama Room, the student shelter and the safety fencing in the car park. The College Parent Group have been very supportive of these projects with allocation of funds from the Parent Group levy.

2018 has presented challenges for many families of the College. The Western Australian economy has impacted on the state and growth in our area has slowed. This has meant that many families faced struggles that had not previously been experienced. Despite this, families, staff and the wider College community have supported students to achieve notable success.

Our College continues to strive to provide increased opportunities and levels of care for the development of our students. I extend sincere gratitude to all for their wonderful efforts. To the College Board members, with Chairperson Mr Gavan Prunster, for the oversight of the College financial and capital programs, and the Parent Group, with Chairperson Mrs Lee-Ann Alcock, for their excellent support of students with hospitality at many events this year. The Parent Group also supported the Cybersafety presentations to students and parents.

The College is fortunate to have staff of high calibre. I thank Mr Andrew Billingsley, Deputy Principal, and the other members of the Executive who provide excellent leadership in the faith, pastoral and academic dimensions for students, ably supported by the Care Group teachers. The Executive is very ably supported by the Heads and Coordinators of Learning Area, who this year have overseen the continued implementation of the Western Australian Curriculum and have further developed utilisation of digital technologies for learning. I extend gratitude to all members of the Administration, Finance, Grounds and Maintenance, Canteen, Library, Uniform Shop, Teacher Assistants and Technicians for their wonderful support of our teachers, and the development of facilities and services to enable the students' learning experiences to be the best quality possible. An initiative to recognise the significant contribution of staff was to include the presentation of the Decade of Service Medals to staff at the Irene McCormack Day Mass in May.

We congratulate and thank the members of the Class of 2018 for their excellent achievements, service and leadership of the College. We wish our graduating students success and a spirit to tackle the challenges that life presents. We encourage our graduates to go out into the local, national and global communities to make our world a better place and to use the words of the College motto "Prayer, Service and Justice as the guiding light" of their daily lives. We are proud of all members of the Class of 2018 as ambassadors of Irene McCormack Catholic College.

Thank you to all members of the College staff, all students and their family members for your excellent commitment, through personal effort and in working partnership, to enable our College to be an outstanding Catholic learning community.

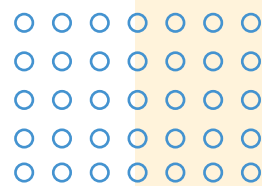
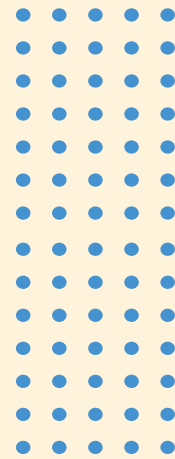

It is a privilege and honour to present the 2018 College Board Report.

The role the College Board is one of stewardship, to plan for the present and future financial operation of the College, liaising in all matters relating to financial management and having a consultative role in advising the Principal with respect to School Policy and assisting with the developing, nourishing and promoting of the Catholic ethos of the College in all its facets 'in trust' for the faith community. I am pleased to report that the Board has fulfilled its governance role and the College is in a sound financial position.

The Board continues to be aware of the financial challenges many families face. In consideration, in increasing the Tuition Fees and Levies by 1% in 2018. With this below CPI increase, financial management has incorporated changes with Australian and State Government funding, increases in salaries and overheads and is in accordance with the minimum recommended increase, made by the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia (CECWA). In 2018 the Board supported the CEWA new school fees policy to increase the increased discount for a families' second child in the school to 20% and the third child to 40% whilst keeping the 100% discount for the fourth child. The Board will work with the College to develop strategies to assist families in the future.

The Board has committed to future capital development planning. The College architects, Parry & Rosenthal Architects, have assisted the College with planning for the extensions to the Science/Technology buildings, new visual arts, home economics, uniform shop, learning support, performing arts, Chapel and future swimming pool, additional courts and car parking.

During 2018 our Parent Group, with a commitment towards continuing to enhance the facilities and appearance of our College, with the help of Grounds and Maintenance Staff completed a

We travelled down the Tanami track to Billiluna's Kururrungku Catholic Education Centre where we spent the next five days. We worked with the students and staff in the classrooms, played sport, set up a community Op Shop, and even taught cheerleading and gymnastics skills. The highlight was our hosting of the community disco and dinner which includes all members of the community, young and old.

Our visit to Balgo's Art Gallery and Jesus' cave proved to be a fabulous day, the history of this small community is very rich. We also spent an evening at Wolfe Creek crater, enjoying the amazing sunset and the incredible landscape where the meteor hit earth 300,000 years ago. Sharing the star-filled skies, wonderful company and food contributed to a very memorable evening.

Whilst learning Japanese, our Year 7 and 8 students have experienced different aspects of the culture, such as origami, calligraphy, manga drawing, anime, traditional games, bento lunch boxes and much more. The Year 8 Japanese class enjoyed a Japanese cultural experience to the Hyogo Prefectural Government Cultural Centre in Perth. During Languages Week, the whole College had the privilege of experiencing the deep-resonating drum rhythms of Japanese Taiko Drumming with an impressive demonstration by Taiko On.

Our French students have broken all Language Perfect records with two outstanding Emerald Awards achieved during the World Championships. Congratulations to Year 9 students Adam EL Kahla and Simon Furneau, who ranked in the top 0.06% in the World. Brandon Hannaby, our French Numbers World Champion, achieved a score of seven seconds on the Language Perfect Dash. French students experienced various French meals, while senior students attended the Première of the French Film Festival at Cinema Paradiso in Northbridge. They also took part in the Alliance Française examinations for the first time.

It is with great anticipation that our College will offer our very first Year 12 ATAR Language course next year with Year 12 ATAR French.

This year our students have benefitted from an extensive range of out-of-school learning and training opportunities.

Five Year 10 students participated in The Get Real Experience and Try (GREaT) Nursing and Midwifery Program gaining first hand nursing experience at Royal Perth Hospital.

Interested students in Years 9 to 11 elected to take part in try-a-trade programs that exposed them to a variety of trades to get a taste of a particular industry of interest including building and construction and electrotechnology.

Years 11 and 12 students completed VET courses externally including Building and Construction, Data and Voice Communications, Retail Cosmetics, Automotive, Hairdressing, Hospitality, Business, Civil Construction, Landscaping, Heath Services, Tourism and Plumbing.

Nine Year 11 students were successful in gaining a two-year scholarship program funded by CTF to complete a Certificate II in Building and Construction.

Year 11 and 12 students, through our workplace learning partner, Onsite, gained work experience in a variety of areas including landscaping, plumbing, construction, engineering, electrical, retail, catering, metal fabrication, travel, automotive painting, hospitality, mechanics, web design, media, childcare, education and aged care.

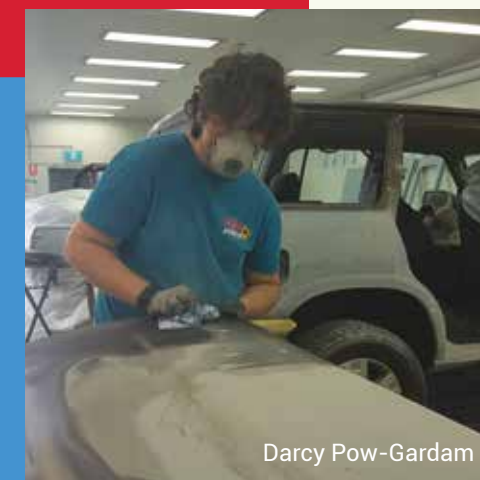
These programs expose students to the variety of career pathways available, as well as developing core employability and interpersonal skills so highly regarded for future training and employment. Many Year 12 students have gained employment through our workplace learning programs.

Students across the years have had presentations related to post-school options from universities, TAFE and other organisations. Woodwork



In 2018 the Digital Information Technologies and Design and Technologies Departments were combined with staff Mr Bastow, Mr Laffite, Mr McHale, Mr Richmond, Mr Warren and Mr Williams. The scope of curriculum offered has included Building & Construction, Digital Media, Digital Technologies, Dimensional Design, Graphic Design, Metalwork and Woodwork, as well as extra-curricular activities Electric Vehicle Challenge and Maker Space.

In Digital Technologies some of the most popular lessons involved coding to program robots, creating virtual worlds for computer games and advanced video editing techniques. In Woodwork and Metalwork students planned, measured, cut, shaped and joined, to create some impressive projects ranging from small wooden toys, plant holders, scooters, adirondack chairs, tool boxes and park benches. Dimensional design students continue to innovate and have worked with 3D printing and laser cutting, creating figurines, lamps, jewellery and drones. In Graphic Design the creations exhibition showcased poster sized graphics of geometric animals and sugar skulls, as well as sticker kits for skateboard decks. Students in Building & Construction have developed skills in bricklaying, tiling, concreting, rendering and carpentry. Student work has been very impressive and has contributed to projects around the College, including the installation of concrete pavers, outdoor tables and picnic shelters.

Maker Space, an extra-curricular club run by Mr McHale, allows students to design and create personal projects using laser cutting or 3D printing. Some interesting projects to emerge from Maker Space in 2018 have included a remote-control plane, small sculptures and jewellery items.

The Electric Vehicle Challenge has really taken off this year, with three teams entering the interschool challenge. In 2017 our car finished seventh place amongst 18 cars. Under the guidance of Mr Richmond, Year 10 students have worked to modify and improve the car's performance. Two new cars were built in aluminium by a Year 11 student and Year 12 team under the guidance of Mr Bastow and Mr Williams.

Legacy

The Sr Irene McCormack mural titled Legacy is inspired by the Peruvian artist El Decorator and Resurrected Irene II by artist Rose Reilly, encompassing symbolism which embodies the spirit of both Sr Irene McCormack and the College. The central crest is a stylised version of the College crest, inspired by a Peruvian cross and has the elements of the Southern Cross embedded within it. The crest features the Body of Christ and Chalice, a focus of our faith. The Callistemon Citrinus flowers, which are colloquially known as Mary MacKillop Bottlebrushes, allude to Australia's first saint, as well as Sr Irene's own Australian heritage. Sr Irene wears the emblem of the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, the order founded by Mary MacKillop.

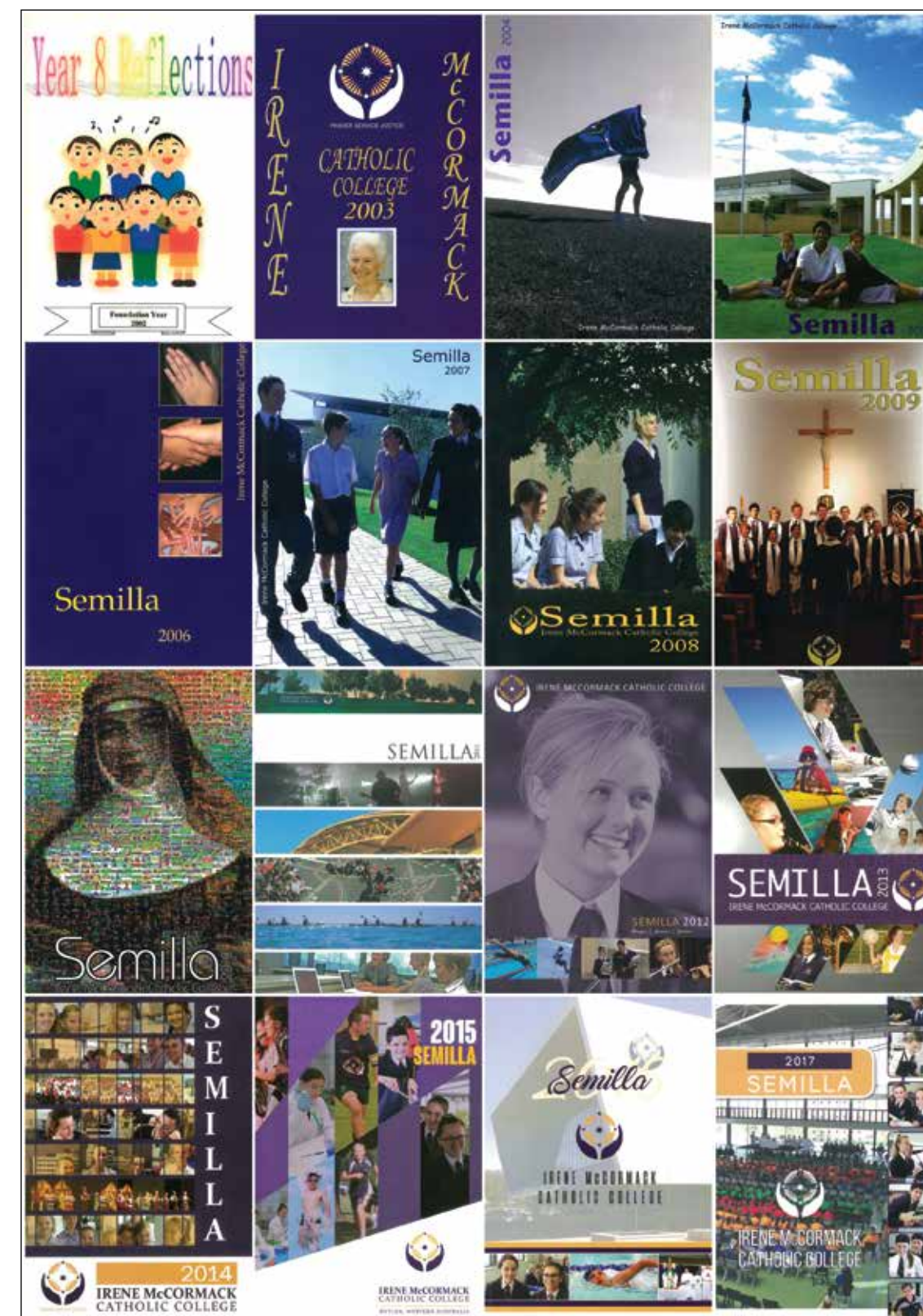
This mural was presented as a gift to the College from the Class of 2017 to express their gratitude for many years of support and education, as well as to personally pay tribute to Sr Irene.

The mural is proudly displayed in the College Undercroft.



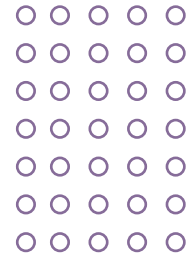
