2016 will be remembered for the Blessing and Opening of the Paul Rafter Centre on 30th June. The building recognises the vision, effort and personal sacrifice of the College Foundation Principal, Mr Paul Rafter, the staff, students and family members to establish what we have heard many times this year, 'the best school in the area'.

The spirit of our founders lives on with the significant achievements by our current students, staff and the wider College community.

This year we marked the 25th Anniversary of Sr Irene McCormack's death on 25th May. Features of the commemoration were the inaugural Irene's Pilgrimage by Year 10 students, visiting significant Western Australian locations where Irene lived, studied and taught, and the acquisition of the glass artwork of 'Resurrected Irene II' by artist Rose Reilly.

The College is fortunate to have excellent support from the wider Catholic community, especially from Fr Robert Carrillo, St Andrew's Parish Priest and his assistant Fr Israel Quirit. We were well represented by students and staff at Year Group Parish Sunday Masses. Nine students received Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist and or Confirmation this year.

Irene's Service Learning Program continues to offer more opportunities for students and staff. In June, Year 11 and 12 students, along with staff, had an immersion experience at Kururrungku Catholic Education Centre, Billiluna, in the Kimberley Region. Year 10 students and staff volunteered to assist at the Wheelchair for Kids workshops in Wangara.

The academic performance of students continues to improve. Senior students have been successful with ATAR courses and VET Certificate courses, and the NAPLAN results have been the best achieved by Year 7 and 9 students.

In the extra-curricular program, including Sport and Performing Arts and other areas, our students continue to excel. Of note this year is the best overall results by our Performing Arts students in the Catholic Performing Arts Festival and the first time we have had a College Football team win a West Perth District Schools Competition.



Our College continues to strive to provide increased opportunities and level of care for the development of our students. For this to happen all members of the community share in the vision and selflessly contribute to the College. I extend sincere gratitude to all for their wonderful efforts.

To the College Board members, with our Chairperson Mr Chris Erikson, for their oversight of the College financial and capital programs. The Parent Group, with Chairperson Mrs Tania Whiting, has given excellent support to students with many events. The Parent Group assisted with the funding of the 'Resurrected Irene II' glass artwork.

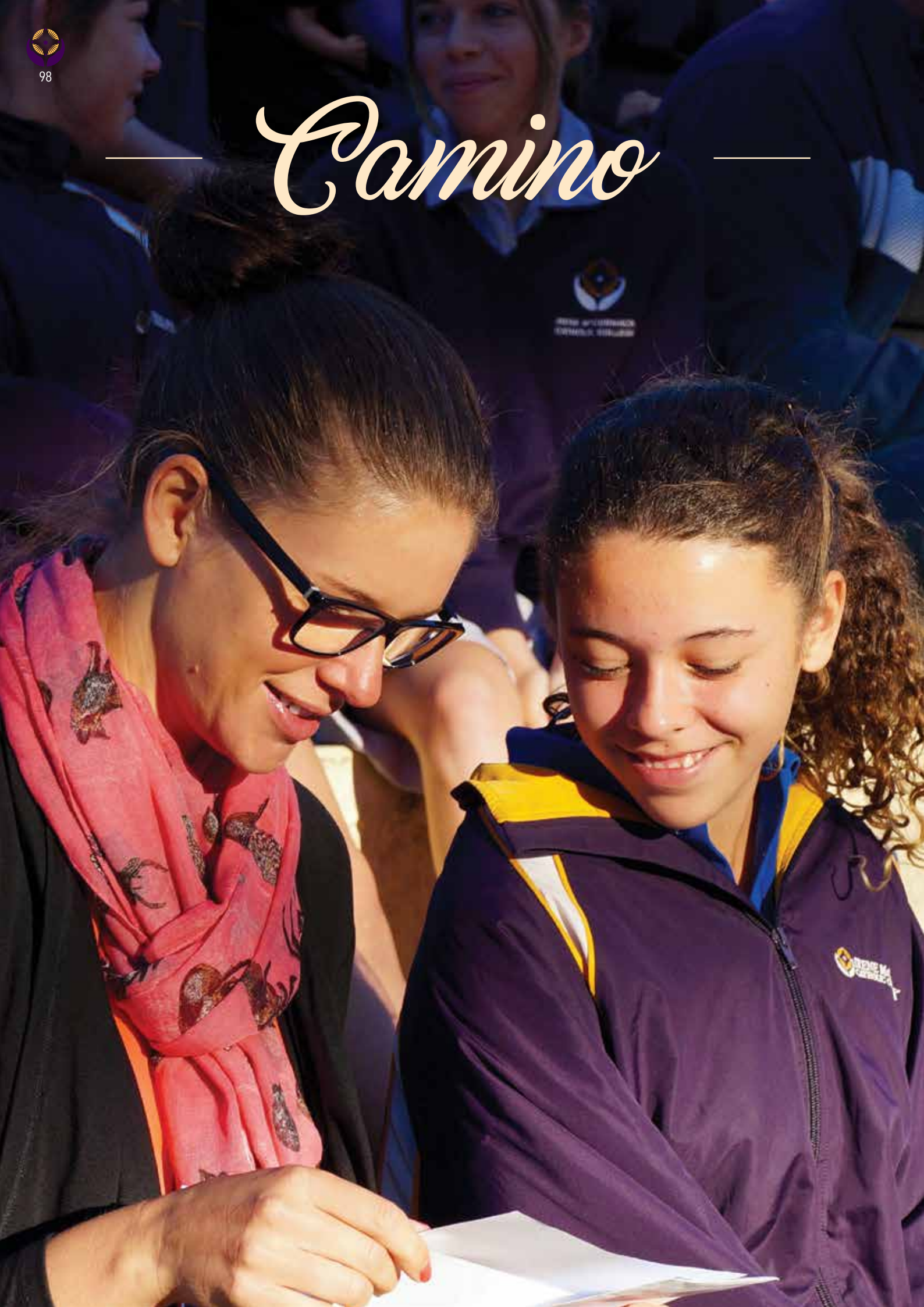
Four Year 11 students represented the College with distinction at the Catholic Youth Summit held at Notre Dame University in Fremantle and contributed well to the program.

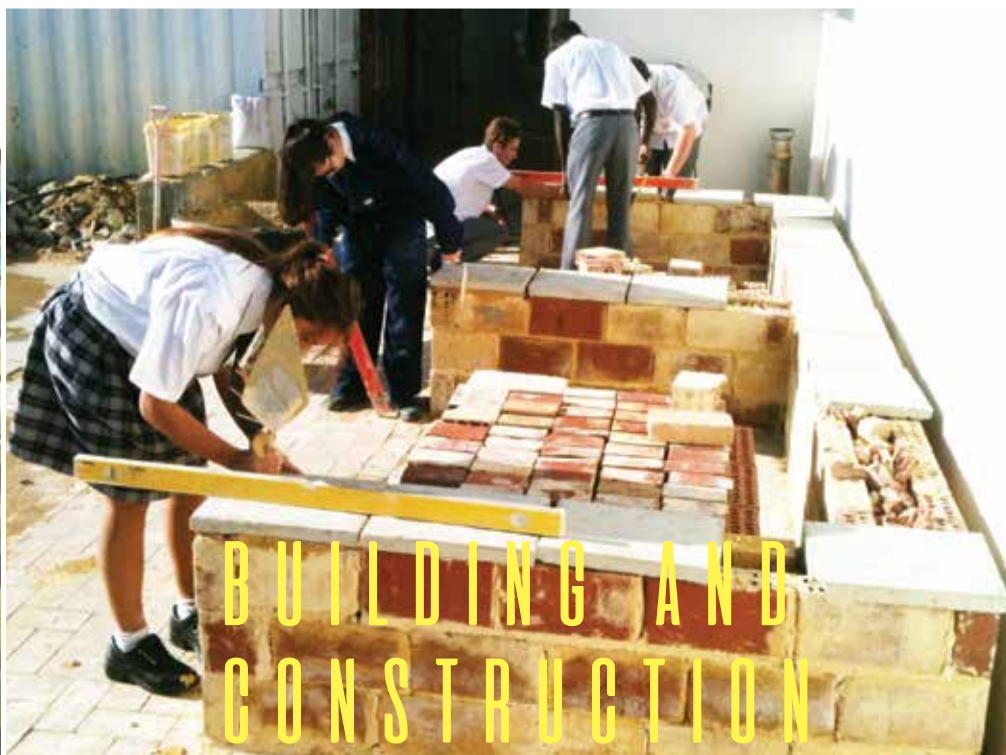

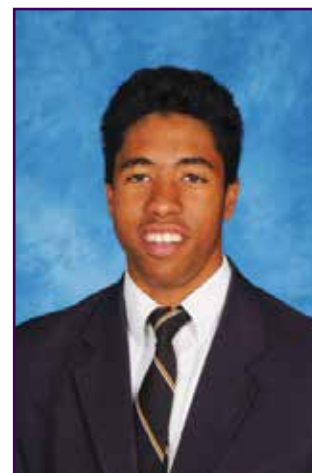

'Resurrected Irene II', created by Rose Reilly, was blessed by Most Reverend Donald G Sproxton DD VG, Auxiliary Bishop of Perth on 30th June 2016.

'Resurrected Irene II' was inspired by the original 'Resurrected Irene I', a cut glass mosaic icon that is a narrative of the life of Sr Irene McCormack, Sister of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, completed on 21st May 2007. It is featured at the Mary MacKillop Centre, South Perth.

Sr Irene was murdered on the 21st May 1991 with four significant male villagers in the town square of Huasahuasi, in the Andes Mountains of Peru, by members of the paramilitary group, The Shining Path.

The 'Resurrected Irene II' is based on symbolism and represents the eternal journey of Irene. Irene's journey began in the wheatbelt of Western Australia. The green glass expresses Irene's early life at Trayning with her family portrayed as leaves on a sheaf of wheat, in the bottom left corner. Each member of her family is represented, with Irene's presence missing. You will see her 'leaf' placed with her spirit above her head. The blue pathway is Irene's life leading to and ending in the Andes mountains of Peru. The tree of knowledge on the right represents Irene's career as a teacher, the purple glass within the tree is her spiritual and religious journey. On the right are the women and children of Huasahuasi, who were so dear to Irene. The chalice above the rocks is the fountain in the centre of the Huasahuasi plaza, where Irene and the four men were murdered. From the fountain flows Irene's blood and the blood of Christ, with water representing a continuation of life. The men killed alongside Irene are depicted as four grey rocks at the foot of the icon. Irene is the central figure, resurrected and dancing... forever Irene. The red dress depicts the colour of Sr Irene's favourite football team, South Fremantle and her love of the Peruvian people. The national colours of Peru are red and white. The gold emblem attached to the dress is the emblem worn by the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart. The gold flecks emanating from the dress reflect Irene's spirit as it begins its eternal journey... her resurrection culminating with bursts of colour in the sky as her spirit enters heaven.

'Resurrected Irene II' was constructed as a large architectural kiln formed glass panel. The fusing of the glass components creates a contemporary image, reflecting the modern design of the Paul Rafter Centre.

'Resurrected Irene II' is a gift to the College through the generosity of the McCormack family, the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, Irene McCormack Catholic College Parent Group, Ian Dixon from Perth Art Glass and the passion and creativity of Rose Reilly.
