## Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines (2020)*.

The aim of the national data collection is to collect quality information that will help education authorities and schools to better support students with disability.

The data collection will take place on 18<sup>th</sup> June, 2021. All data collected will remain confidential and will be reported to Catholic Education of Western Australia (CEWA) and the Federal Government.
