## Covid19 Restrictions Monday 28<sup>th</sup> – Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> June

Earlier today the WA Minister for Health, Roger Cook announced COVID-19 restrictions are now in place for the Perth and Peel regions for a minimum of three days, effective from 12.00 noon today. In particular, mask wearing is mandatory indoors, on public transport, and outdoors where physical distancing is not possible.

### ARRANGEMENTS FOR PERTH AND PEEL REGION SCHOOLS

- All staff members and students in Years 7 to 12 in the Perth and Peel regions are required to wear a mask whilst indoors when at school and on public transport. Masks are also to be worn outdoors if physical distancing is not possible. This applies to classrooms, all teaching areas and libraries and staffrooms. However, teachers may, remove their mask if it interferes with their ability to clearly communicate with students.
- Common sense should apply regarding the colour and markings on masks, with staff and students asked not to wear masks that may contain inappropriate markings or designs.

### Parents, caregivers, and visitors on school premises

- Visitors to our College must wear a mask indoors and adhere to COVID-safe guidelines. If parents, caregivers, and visitors are outdoors on a school site, masks must be worn if physical distancing is not possible.

### Indoor venues and activities

- A 150-person limit – and the two square metre capacity rule - applies to indoor public venues. This includes theatres, concert halls, cinemas and performing arts centres.
- Masks are mandatory for indoor venues with exemption for medical reasons and for primary school aged children or younger.
- Indoor school facilities including school halls, gymnasiums, libraries, community centres, museums, galleries and recreation centres may open subject to observing the two square metre rule.
- Masks are required to be worn at all indoor venues, with exemption for medical reasons or for primary school aged children and younger.

Students should not attend school if unwell and should stay home and be tested. If you have any queries, please contact your son or daughter's respective Assistant Deputy Principal or me.
